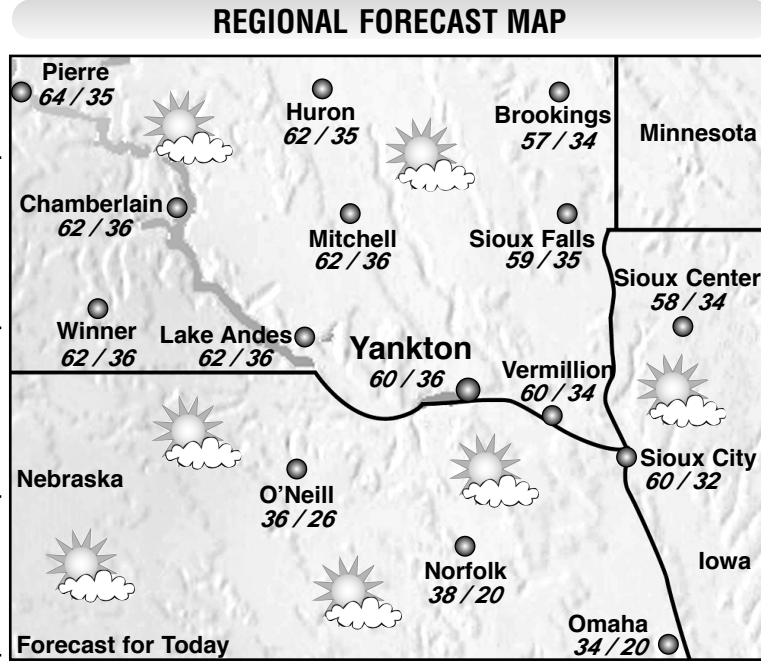

### 75 YEARS AGO

Monday, April 8, 1935  
The city election campaign rests today where it stood Saturday — with two candidates for the mayoralty, two for finance commissioner and five nominees for the two justice of the peace positions.

Monday, April 8, 1985  
The Farmers Home Administration is experiencing its busiest spring in many years as more and more South Dakota farmers turn to the federal agency for operating loans.  
Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev said he has agreed to a summit meeting with President Reagan and that he ordered a temporary freeze in deployment of nuclear missiles in Europe.

### CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

Wheat for May delivery jumped 11.75 cents to \$4.7525 a bushel, while May corn climbed 10 cents to \$3.565 a bushel and oats for May delivery rose 7.25 cents to \$2.175 a bushel. May soybeans added 8 cents to \$9.525 a bushel.  
June live cattle gained 1.18 cents to 94.75 cents a pound; May feeder cattle advanced 1.03 cents to \$1.1425 a pound; June lean hogs edged up 0.3 cent to 84.6 cents a pound; and May pork bellies rose 0.78 cent to 96.45 cents a pound.
