He knew each of the faces so well. He had created them. He knew every smile, laugh, and shed tear.

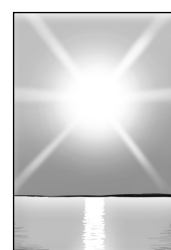
But now they were contorted with rage and anger...his heart broke.

FEMA and USDA who are here to assess the damage firsthand."

Johnson has also been assessing damage caused by James River flooding. He expressed particular concern about flooded farmland.

"The Jim River area has been hurt badly," he said. "Down by Yankton, it's not as bad. But they will have issues with prevented planting up north. In those areas, they are not likely doing anything this summer."

Federal, state and local officials are working with the preliminary damage assessments, Johnson said. The damage report will be forwarded to Gov. Mike Rounds, who can request a presidential disaster declaration.

If the president issues a disaster declaration, the federal government covers 75 percent of the total costs for reimbursement. The other 25 percent is covered by state and local sources.

During the tour, Centerville Mayor Jay Ostrem - who also serves as a Turner County deputy sheriff - said his town was spared any extensive damage.

However, the surrounding area

was another story, Ostrem said. Centerville was surrounded by flooding on all sides except to the east, which travelers could access with Highway 46.

Ostrem pointed to Highway 19, which runs south of Centerville and was closed for an extended period.

"Highway 19 was one gigantic lake," he said. "It was nothing but water with an asphalt ribbon running through it."

To the north, Highway 461 has seen problems as part of a flood zone, Ostrem said.

"Highway 461 is an important farm-to-market road for us," he said. "It goes from Centerville to the ethanol plant at Chancellor, which creates problems for people commuting to work there or hauling corn."

Ostrem took detours during flooding to reach work at the sheriff's office in Parker, and emergency responders were aware of flooded roads.

Flooding has been particularly hard on farmland, with many fields still under water, Ostrem said. Farmers used boats to retrieve unsecured gas-fired pumps and fuel tanks, he said.

Water went over the tops of levees or blew out the structures altogether, he said. "It opened areas wide enough that you could drive a truck through it," he said.

Floating debris created problems for bridges, and sediment and corn husks were still visible in fields, Ostrem said.

The senator's visit provided a valuable boost to the area, Ostrem said.

"We are very humbled to have Sen. Johnson here, that he would request a visit to Centerville," the mayor said.

The coming weeks will tell a great deal about crop prospects, said Brad Wilkens, district director for the Farm Service Agency (FSA). The area grows mainly corn and beans, with the market making a difference in crop selection, he said.

"It's a bit early to tell what will happen in the area. You may have prevented planting," he said. "We are cautiously optimistic. As you get away from the flood, you have areas that appear somewhat normal."

Tom Gillespie, the Turner County emergency manager, said he was happy to see Johnson's awareness of local problems. The senator grew up in the Centerville and Vermillion areas.

"I really was happy to see Sen. Johnson and the enthusiasm he showed," Gillespie said. "I liked his willingness to come down and look at the problem, to see it firsthand. He knows the area, and

he is able to see the big picture."

Derek Jensen with the FEMA office in Denver said he was interested to see the flooding impacts even after the water went down. He anticipates some water will remain for quite some time.

Jensen noted the difference between public assistance, which covers public infrastructure covered by a disaster declaration, and individual assistance for private property.

FEMA and other agencies anticipated bad flooding this year, Jensen said.

State officials have toured the flooded southeast by air and on the ground, said Tom Welch, regional coordinator for the state Department of Public Safety.

Welch recently visited Yankton with Gov. Rounds and DPS Secretary Tom Dravland, talking with local officials about James River flooding.

"The James River will be high all season," Welch predicted. "You have the flooding, and it's all part of a complicated water management system."

Johnson's visit to the Centerville area should provide valuable input and information, Welch said. "It's always good to have (government officials) get a ground view," he said.
