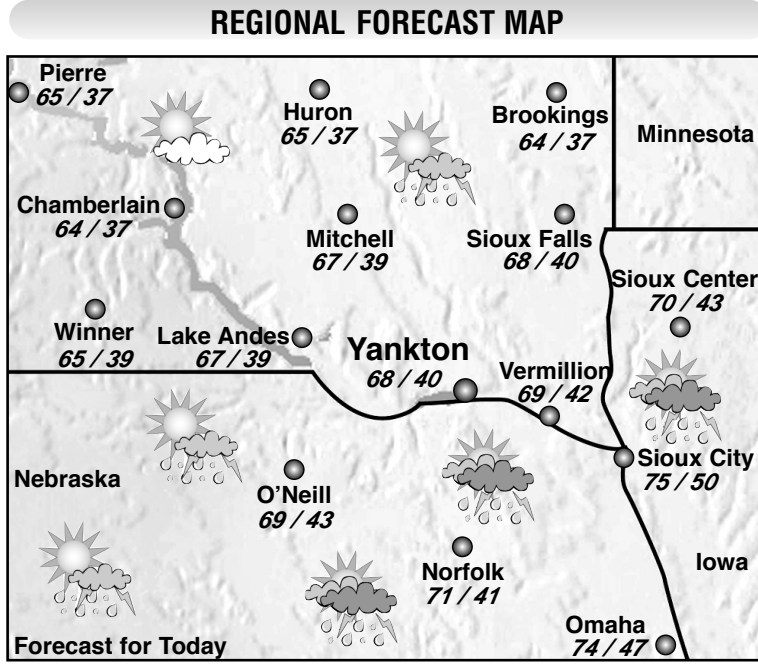

Wheat for July delivery lost 1.5 cents to \$4.8725 a bushel, while July corn climbed 5.25 cents to \$3.685 a bushel and soybeans for May delivery added 1 cent to \$9.69 a bushel. May oats were unchanged at \$2.1575 a bushel.
June live cattle fell 0.52 cent to 92.95 cents a pound; May feeder cattle shed 1.4 cents to \$1.122 a pound; June lean hogs edged down 0.52 cent to 84.95 cents a pound; and May pork bellies slipped 0.65 cent to 94.05 cents a pound.
