DIARY OF A WIMPY KID (Y) ★★1/2. Workmanlike adaptation of the popular Jeff Kinney tween novels about the Everyboy stuck in the middle of middle school. With Zachary Gordon and Robert Capron. 2 hrs. PG (rude humor, language)

DATE NIGHT (Y-Ve) ★★ A mild-mannered New Jersey mom and dad (Tina Fey and Steve Carell) — a Realtor and an accountant! — are confused for shakedown artists, a case of mistaken identity that launches them on a Manhattan misadventure. It boasts a deft supporting cast that includes Mark Wahlberg, well-used as Claire's hunky ex-client, Taraji P.
