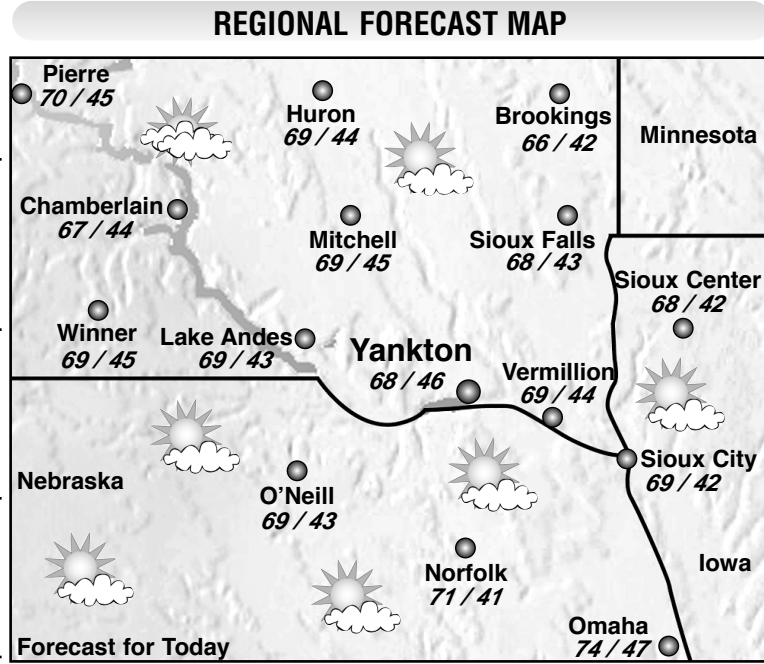

DEADWOOD — The Yankton Press & Dakotan won several awards in the South Dakota Newspaper Association's (SDNA) Better Newspapers Contest, the results of which were announced this weekend at the SDNA state convention in Deadwood.

City editor Nathan Johnson won first place for Best General Interest Columns, while regional editor Randy Dockendorf won second place for Best Sports Reporting and third place for Best Headline Writing. Editor Kelly Hertz took second place for Best Editorial Writing.

Also, the Press & Dakotan finished second in the General Excellence category (Dailies under 14,000) and third place for Best Newspaper Web Site (all daily newspapers). Gary Wood is publisher of the P&D, and Beth Rye is the new media director.

Also locally, the Yankton County Observer won five awards, the Freeman Courier won General Excellence and the Sweepstakes Award for Weeklies 1,151-2,050, and the Parkston Advance won General Excellence for Weeklies Under 1,150.

the process," he said.

In that respect, Unzicker said he has faith in his parishioners and the process they are undertaking.

"We have put together a really good (building) committee," he said. "Tuesday night, they went a long time with the church council meeting because they went through a lot of things."

The building committee will return to the church council, which will present two or three plans to the congregation for a final vote. Once a plan has been selected, the church will turn the project over to the budget committee to start the bidding process.

Both Kropuenske and Unzicker emphasized that Spring Valley is taking its time before making any final decisions.

Parishioners had a chance to reflect during the two-week period between the fire and the vote on whether to rebuild, Kropuenske said.

"We have to do things the right way," he said. "We have to be careful if we go too fast."

Unzicker advised against quick decisions on the church's future. "The fire was only three weeks ago. It's not a simple adjustment," he said.

The state fire marshal's finding of an electrical cause for the fire has actually been a blessing, Unzicker said.

"I am really glad that it's not arson, which is a violent act, or some other cause where someone feels to blame for the rest of

his or her life," he said.

Even with a new church, some things can't be replaced after the fire, Kropuenske said.

"We lost an 108-year-old picture. We lost a quilt that the women made in the 1940s. We had another quilt knitted by a lady," he said. "The (insurance) adjuster asked, 'What value do you put on it?' You really don't, and we lost it all."

Offers of assistance have been received from across the nation, Unzicker said. "I find it humbling that people would do that much to help," he said.

The Spring Valley Lutheran Church Benefit Fund has been established at the Wells Fargo Bank in Viborg, Kropuenske said.

The congregation of about 220 members is "doing very well" despite its trying times, Unzicker said. Updates will be provided throughout the building process, he said.

"We will have mini-meetings to get input and so nobody feels left out," he said.

Kropuenske pointed to a hopeful sign for the future.

"We had a couple who had their baby baptized, joined the church as members and voted for rebuilding the church, all at the same service," he said.

However, he knows many challenges lie ahead.

"We are anxious to go forward," he said. "But it will be a process, and there will be some bumps in the road. We need to stick through this whole thing as a congregation."

Kropuenske remains anxious for a return to the church's former home.

"We just want to get the view back up on that hill," he said.
