He also plans to push forward with infrastructure improvements.

The Catholic college has an endowment of \$12 million, which has regained much of its value after last year's national recession and market meltdown, Krause said.

"We are financially solid," he said. "We are not wealthy, but our budget is balanced and we anticipate a balanced budget next year."

MMC operates on an annual budget of \$16 million, with the bulk coming from tuition, Krause said. The college needs to act boldly by investing in its students and its operations, he said.

"You can't cut yourself to prosperity," he said. "If you do that, you will continue spiraling downward."

To attain the needed resources, Krause looks to boost two areas — enrollment and fund-raising.

Krause wants to launch an aggressive admissions program, with more students meaning more tuition. Enrollment currently stands at about 1,100, with around 500 at Yankton, about 400 at Watertown and the remainder at the nurse anesthesia program in Sioux Falls.

In particular, Krause wants to increase enrollment at the Yankton campus.

"We are stagnant right now. We haven't grown," he said. "We hope to double (current enrollment) and reach at least 1,000 students in Yankton."

MMC has done well with its Watertown and Sioux Falls programs, Krause said. The college has added considerably to its nursing enrollment, he said, and the nurse anesthesia program — a master's degree — is moving this week into a new building in Sioux Falls.

To grow enrollment, MMC needs to increase its financial assistance for students, Krause said.

"This past year, we didn't have as much scholarship money as we would have preferred. There will be no enrollment growth without a financial aid package," he said.

"We need an investment on the endowment side. As much as the market slid, much of it is back. We are doing anything possible to make more scholarships available."

MMC currently charges \$25,500 annually for tuition, fees, room and board, Krause said. Ninety-nine percent of MMC students receive financial aid package amounting to \$18,000.

Last year, MMC awarded more than \$8 million in aid. Awards include grants and scholarships from MMC, as well as federal assistance, work study and loan programs.

The Mount Marty board of trustees meets in May and will give its input on tuition and fees, Krause said. The college is looking at a 4 percent increase, he said.

Mount Marty will continue its commitment to a liberal arts curriculum, personalized instruction and strong career areas such as nursing, business and teacher education, he said.

"We have an outstanding nursing program, so we need to expand on it," he said. "We could extend the range of the programs, maybe (Licensed Practical Nurse) or a masters degree in nursing."

MMC will also bolster its marketing campaign with more media and advertising in order to reach more people, he said.

"We do not do a great job selling the value of what we have here to our core audience within a 100-mile radius," he said. "We have outstanding opportunities in our Catholic parishes."

However, MMC will continue reaching out to non-Catholic students as well as students from outside the immediate area, Krause said.

Mount Marty also needs to use its alumni in promoting the school, Krause said. That includes getting more teaching graduates into area schools where they provide a visible example of MMC's success, he said.

"We have to make sure that area students are aware of MMC," he said. "The best recruiters are our alumni who are seen out in the community."

MMC is looking at a major capital campaign in the near future, Krause said. The college will reach out to the entire region, including the business community, he said.

Results Of Predator Trapping Under Study

SIoux FALLS (AP) — Trapping predators to protect duck and pheasant nests produces mixed results that a researcher says appear to be tied to the habitat and what kind of marauders are destroying nests.

A three-year study compared nesting success on a 36-square-mile land block in which predators were removed against the nesting success in a comparable block without predator control.

Nests were located and marked in grassy areas in study areas in Roberts, Clark, Codington and Beadle counties and checked every eight days. Hired trappers targeted skunks, raccoons and other predators in selected blocks during the mid-March to mid-July nesting season.

"We definitely found some positive results with the trapping program at increasing both the duck and pheasant nests. We also found that it didn't work in every situation," said Nick Docken, a

graduate student who oversaw the data collection and is using it to write his master's thesis at South Dakota State University.

Delta Waterfowl has been doing predator trapping studies on a larger scale in North Dakota. When it suggested a similar study on duck nesting in South Dakota, the state Department

of Game, Fish and Parks added a pheasant nesting component.

More than 2,700 duck nests and 715 pheasant nests were located in the 14 plots during the three years of study. The pheasant count was lower because the nests are harder to find and the pheasant population is lower in the northeast study areas.
