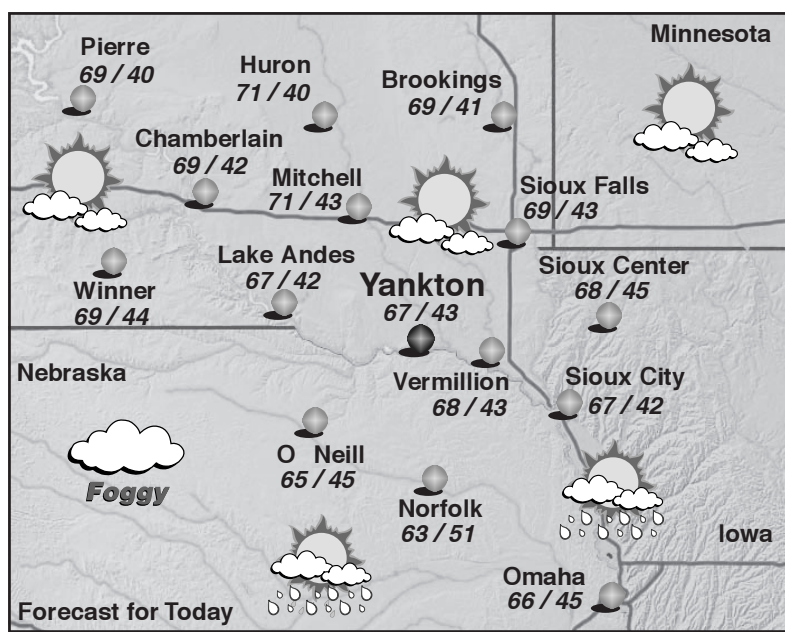

CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE
 Agriculture futures rose Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for July delivery jumped 19 cents to \$4.985 a bushel, while July corn climbed 8 cents to \$3.6525 a bushel and oats for July delivery rose 2.25 cents to \$2.155 a bushel. July soybeans added 7.5 cents to \$9.94 a bushel. Meanwhile, beef futures traded mixed and pork futures fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle inched up 0.1 cent to 94.6 cents a pound; May feeder cattle lost 0.5 cent to \$1.1255 a pound; June lean hogs fell 0.85 cent to 85.5 cents a pound; and May pork bellies dropped 1.25 cents to 97.85 cents a pound.
