down shortly and move it to the annex they built in Yankton," said Chamber President Steve Huff. "That means that building is going to be vacant."

Pahl said the National Trust has successfully fought against post office closures in the past and could help. She also encouraged the delegation to discuss the matter with their congressional representatives.

Later in the day, the delegation met with Tony Niles, the deputy chief of the Corps of Engineers' Northwest Division Regional Integration Team. Concerns were shared about sedimentation of the Missouri River upstream from Gavins Point Dam and scouring of the riverbed below it.

"The sedimentation effects we're seeing upstream and downstream are not unexpected," Niles said. "The Corps continues to monitor it. What I understand ... is that the sedimentation effects are settling down. Downstream from the Gavins Point Dam, they had a total of 11 feet change since the dam was built. But it has slowed down considerably in recent years. They're saying now it is less than a tenth of a foot every year change in the morphology due to scouring."

Scouring of the riverbed has forced the City of Yankton to find new water intake methods.

Furthermore, Niles said there is currently no feasible plan to deal with the sedimentation occurring above the dam.

"They're continuing to look at it," he said.

The delegation also met with officials from the National Park Service, who encouraged locals to organize regular roundtable meetings about how to improve the trail system around the Missouri National Recreational River and further enhance the park's tourism draw. Unique partnerships need to be forged that "break down boundaries," they said.

A meeting with Michele Laur, the acting deputy chief of the Natural Resources

Conservation Service, included a discussion of finding ways to make the installation of a sanitary sewer system in the Lewis and Clark Lake area feasible.

"Once a sewer line is done, development would explode very, very quickly," City Manager Doug Russell said.

While meetings with Sens. Tim Johnson and John Thune, as well as Rep. Stephanie Herseth Sandlin, varied in length because of their sometimes demanding schedules, the delegation covered the same basic ground with all of them.

Russell discussed the potential expansion of the NFAA facility in the near future and asked that the project receive support if it materializes.

"It's one of those big ideas we think we can get done incrementally," he said in the meeting with Johnson.

Russell also encouraged political support for a grant submitted to fund improvements for downtown Yankton. Private investors have already been asking about development possibilities as conversion of the Meridian Bridge into a recreational trail nears, he said.

"Downtown Yankton is great, but there is much more to do," Johnson said, pledging to do what he could to get the funding appropriated.

Yankton Economic Development Director Mike Dellinger shared the community's recent economic development successes, including the addition of approximately 60 jobs in the next several years. He also asked for support for a curriculum expansion at RTEC that would tie into the data center being completed along West City Limits Road.

Walking and taxing around the Capitol for two days covering such a wide array of issues left the delegation exhausted but energized about all they had learned and what it could do for Yankton.

Reflecting on the two days of meetings, Huff said, "This trip is at least equally important as our annual Chamber trip to Pierre, if not more so."
