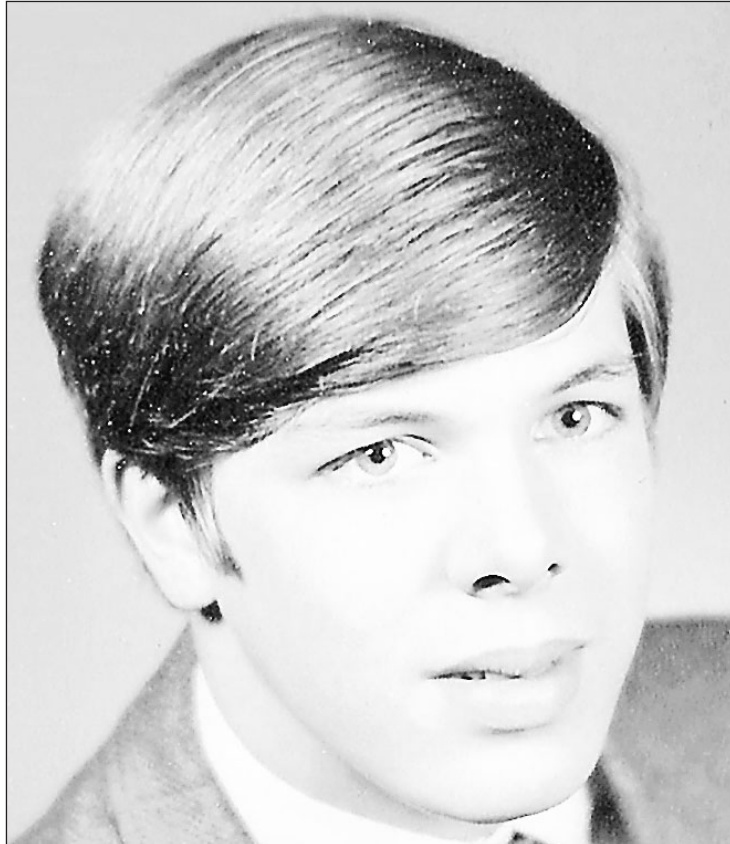

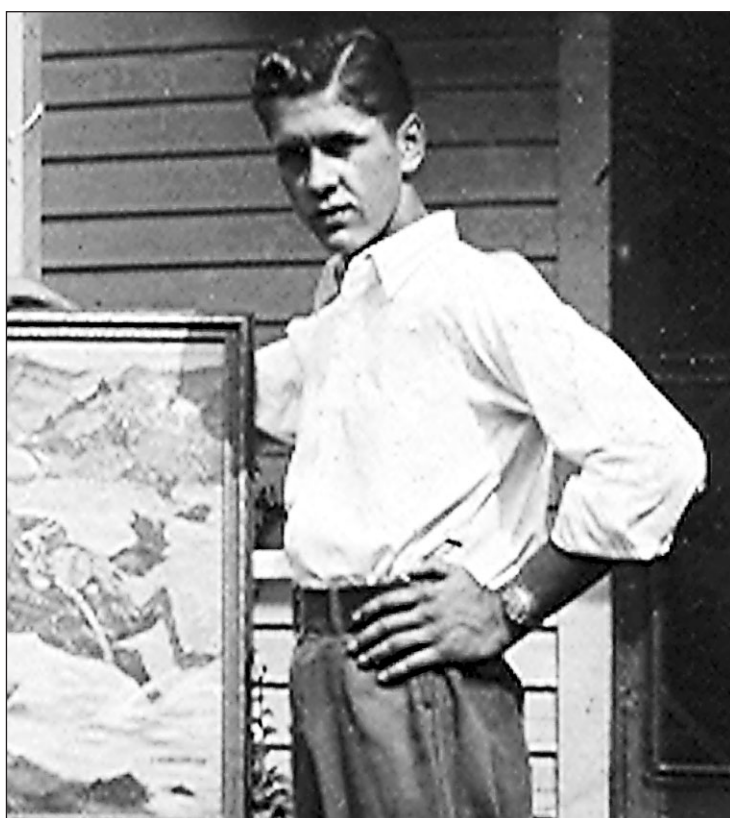

Five To Be Inducted Into YHS Fine Arts Shrine

A writer, two artists and two musicians will be inducted into the Yankton High School Fine Arts Hall of Fame on Tuesday, May 4, before the Fine Arts Assembly recognizing students for their participation in the Fine Arts.

Inducted will be Terry Wright, class of 1970, for his writing, Diane Christopherson Radack, class of 1960, and Clayton Christopherson, class of 1931, for their art, and Julie Neufeld, class of 1959, and Gary Hansen, class of 1969, for their music.

The reception for the new inductees will begin at 6:30 p.m. in the High School Commons. The induction of the five and the fine arts awards will start at 7:30 p.m. in the YHS Theatre and be followed by an ice cream social in the Commons.

TERRY WRIGHT

Terry Wright is a professor of writing at the University of Central Arkansas, a position that he has held since 1985. Before that Wright was the associate dean in the College of Fine Arts and Communication at the University of Central Arkansas.

His works have appeared in over 100 publications including Rolling Stone magazine, McSweeney's, the Lifted Brow, Slipstream, Puerto del Sol, Sequoia, Without Halos, and the Nebraska Review.

In 1996 he published the book What the Black Box Said, and he has completed three chapbooks with a fourth one to be published this year.

Wright has been recognized with literary awards from the Arkansas Arts Council as an Individual Artist Fellowship in Poetry and the Arkansas Literary Society as the winner of the poetry prize and as the winner of the fiction prize. He was a finalist for the Arkansas Artist of the Year in 1996.

In the visual arts, he has been recognized by the Museum of Computer Art in New York City. His web page was named as a distinguished art site in 2000 and 2004. In 2003 USA Today recognized his art web site Rooms with a View as a "hot site."

Wright earned his bachelor of arts in English and drama from Morningside College, his master's degree in English and American Literature from the University of Arkansas and his masters of fine arts from Bowling Green University.

DIANE CHRISTOPHERSON RADACK

Diane Christopherson Radack has been an artist and art teacher since she was 5 years old. Her father Clayton Christopherson inspired Radack to become an artist, and he became her teacher because art was not a part of the high school curriculum.

While Radack was in high school, she made posters for every high school event. Known as the "sign person," she was the art director of the high school yearbook.

Radack followed in her mother's footsteps when Radack opened a floral, craft and art business following her graduation from high school. Designing flower arrangements gave her a great foundation in color and design. She taught classes after attending workshops and seminars to learn more.

When her youngest child graduated from high school and started college, Radack headed for college at the University of South Dakota. She began to attend summer Art Fairs.

In 1994 she began teaching in Iowa and continued to participate in Art Fairs. She retired from teaching in 2008.

Radack has exhibited her works in Iowa, Minnesota, South Dakota and New York.

In 1998, her class vessel was selected by the Friends of Iowa Public TV as their major

donor gift during the annual pledge drive. Radack designed the Christmas by Lake City ornament and was the featured artist in the 2005 summer show in Clear Lake, Iowa.

Radack's home was selected to be in the Tour of Homes in 2005 and her garden was chosen to be in the Tour of Gardens in 2005.

Radack lives in Brooklyn, N.Y., near her son and his family. Her other three children live in Minneapolis. She is concentrating on her painting.

Radack said she will always find time to hug a child, tell a story or paint a picture.

CLAYTON CHRISTOPHERSON

Clayton Christopherson was involved in art all of his life.

After attending the Minneapolis Institute of Art and the Federal School of Art in Minneapolis, he returned to Yankton College where he produced his largest collection of paintings.

While in the service, he graduated from the Army Corps of Engineer Topographical School and studied lettering under Frederick Goudy, the founder of modern letter type. During World War II, he was a topographic draftsman, camouflage and bridge designer. His fellow soldiers became subjects as he drew portraits for soldiers who sent them home as greeting cards. He designed church bulletin covers while he was in France.

When the war was over, Christopherson returned to Yankton and his sign business, which included all kinds of commercial art: advertising design, lettering, map work, advertising brochures and booklets and architectural designs.

Christopherson designed placemats for restaurants, the cover for the Dakota Territory Jubilee and the Dakota Territorial
