The Yankton area got its first taste of summer Saturday as thunderstorms dumped heavy rain and hail on parts of the area. Yankton officially received a total of 1.28 inches of rain Saturday, most of it coming from a storm that hit the city at about 2 p.m. It produced sleet, then pea-sized hail that accumulated in many spots. There was also brief flooding on some streets and low-lying areas. Several other places in the area also received rain and hail. Freeman had considerable hail and some street flooding from another storm that moved through the region. More rain is possible today (Monday), with another chance of rain predicted for the end of the week.

Mount Marty College will host a student reading and "Paddlefish" awards presentation at the college's Noon Forum on Thursday, April 29, in the South Dining Room of the Roncalli Center.
