about taking the Brooklyn Park, Minn. native with one of their late-round draft picks. If not, the former Coyote would be their top free agent priority. "When I got the phone call and heard it was my agent, I didn't know what to think," Quaye said Saturday from Vermillion. "Then he said he had good news. When he said, 'It's a wrap; you're a Jaguar,' it was kind of surreal. "I just thank God they gave me a shot."

Quaye, a first team All-Great West Conference selection last year after helping USD finish first in scoring defense and rushing defense, said he had been in contact with Jaguars defensive line coach Joe Cullen every day since last Monday. "Coach Cullen said they liked the way I play, especially my passion for the game," Quaye said. "They liked the explosion and the play-making ability I can bring to the table. I really think I can make the team down there, but only if I work really hard like I always have."

Quaye will fly to Florida on Thursday night to spend the weekend with the Jaguars. He said he plans to be back in Vermillion next Tuesday to finish school and finalize his impending graduation plans. For USD, seeing Shepard and Quaye sign free agent deals with NFL teams marked the first time since 2006 that the program sent two former players to the next level at the same time. In that year, A.J. Schable signed with the Cardinals and Nick Hagemann landed with the Pittsburgh Steelers. "I couldn't be happier for Ko, he's an amazing player and I know his new teammates will love him," Shepard said. "It was a pretty good day for USD. And I'm sure next year, they'll have more players get this chance too."

Arthur joins Noah Shepard and Ko Quaye from USD's 2009 class in furthering their playing career in the National Football League. Arthur was a four-year starter for the Coyote offensive line from 2006-09. He earned All-Great West Conference honors twice while starting in 37 games while in Vermillion. Selected as USD's Most Valuable Lineman as a senior, he helped USD average 460 yards per game (4th in the nation), 202 rushing yards per game (11th in the nation) and 258 passing yards per game (16th in the nation) in 2009.
