Volante. SATS officer and freshman Patrick Linsenmeyer said he did not speak to anyone on campus about posting his own materials by the display.

In a letter to the editor in that same edition, SATS advisor and USD professor Robert Swan wrote, "In a broad sense, SATS (is) simply trying to emphasize the importance of human liberation and expand the marketplace of ideas on the USD campus."

The incident is now being reviewed by the university. "We're a little disappointed because the school

hasn't reacted fast enough to this in our eyes," Dunn said. "We said a letter of apology would be appropriate, maybe not recognizing the student group would be appropriate, or putting them on probation, saying 'You guys have to prove yourself that you can behave.'"

Gage said the incident is starting to incur far-reaching repercussions. "There's alumni that are threatening a boycott of all the businesses in the Volante. They're very outraged people, and this expands beyond our campus and our community through our alumni," he said.

This isn't the first time a Veterans Club display has encountered resistance. Last year, the club displayed a white cross with a red rose wrapped around it — representing POW/MIA — for which they were contacted by the Secular Student Alliance.

"They said, 'Can you just take off the arms of the

cross and make it a stick?'" Dunn said. "So we agreed. We said, 'That's fine, thanks for bringing it to our attention.' There was just an e-mail sent to us, and we fixed it."

"That group went through appropriate channels — as you should if you have a problem with something on campus," Gage said. "You raise attention and you go about the proper way of doing things. This group did not go to anyone and get permission to do anything on campus. In our opinion, it violated students ethics, using their group to attack another student group."

One of the Veterans Club's biggest problems with the recent protest is that it targeted a "non-political memorial."

"This memorial is not to talk about war, it's just to honor people who have died in the service of our country," Dunn said. "Defacing the memorial was totally distasteful."

ting a bigger GOP imprint on the bill or removing Democratic provisions they perceive as government overreach.

Democrats said they were out of patience. "Are we going to start the debate or are we going to shut it down and continue negotiating, negotiating, negotiating?" Sen. Sherrod Brown, D-Ohio, said on ABC's "This Week."

The new derivatives provisions would require most derivatives to go through a new network of clearing-houses and be traded on regulated exchanges.

Lincoln's bill provides some exemptions for firms that use derivatives for commercial purposes to hedge against market fluctuations. It also exempts derivatives linked to foreign exchange rates.

Derivatives are financial products such as corn futures or stock options whose worth depends on

the values of underlying investments. Companies use them to hedge against risks, but they have also been vehicles for speculation and helped trigger the financial crisis when the underlying investments — mortgage-backed securities, for example — plunged in value.

The overarching Senate bill — and a similar bill passed by the House — would create a mechanism for liquidating large firms, set up a council to detect systemwide financial threats, and establish a consumer protection agency to police lending.

The legislation also would require derivatives, blamed for helping precipitate the meltdown, to be traded in open exchanges.

Even if Democrats are unable to proceed to debate after Monday's vote, Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid intends to keep pressure on Republicans.

The political environment favors Democrats. Polls show a public desire to regulate financial institutions, and a recent fraud lawsuit against Goldman Sachs has created a desire by several

Republicans not to be seen as obstructing Wall Street legislation.
