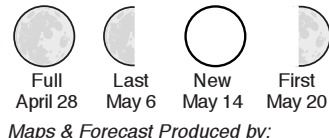

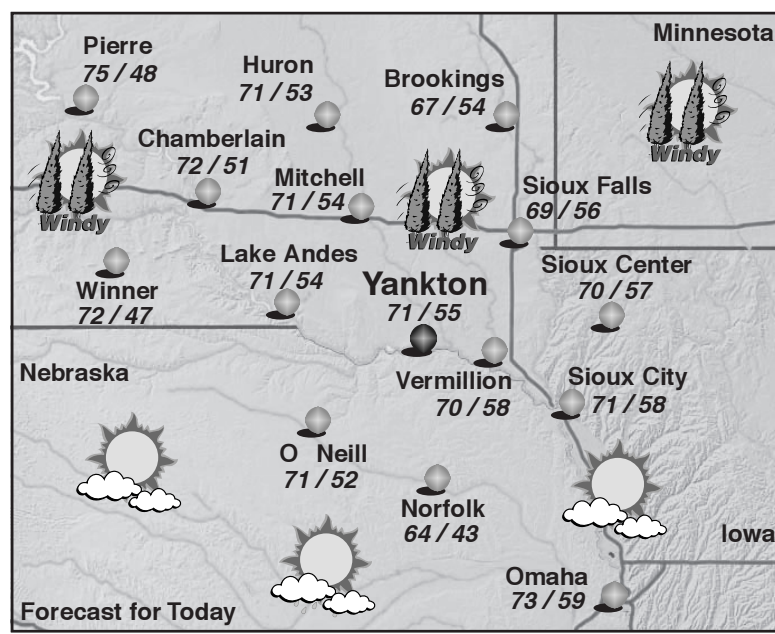

### CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

Agriculture futures were mixed Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
 Wheat for July delivery rose 2.5 cents to \$4.905 a bushel, while July corn slid 5.75 cents to \$3.5375 a bushel and oats for July delivery lost 4 cents to \$2.09 a bushel. July soybeans dropped 16 cents to \$9.93 a bushel.  
 Meanwhile, beef futures traded lower and pork futures advanced on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.  
 June live cattle fell 1.78 cents to 93.72 cents a pound; May feeder cattle slipped 0.68 cent to \$1.1307 a pound; June lean hogs added 0.68 cent to 84.95 cents a pound; and May pork bellies climbed 1.4 cents to 96.5 cents a pound.

Heitkamp, the warning coordination meteorologist with the Sioux Falls National Weather Service office, and includes information on how to recognize conditions that lead to severe summer weather and understanding the development and life cycle of severe storms. The class also includes tips for safe

storm observation.  
 The class is open to the public and is one of only three such classes scheduled in South Dakota this year.  
 Similar classes are held each year in Yankton County coinciding with South Dakota Severe Weather Awareness Week, which runs April 26-30.

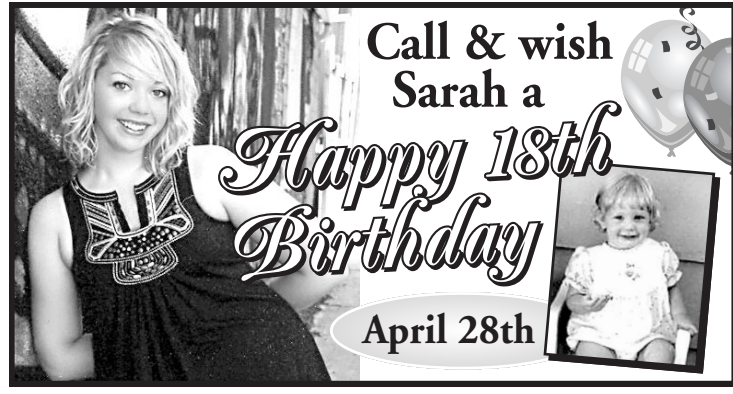
## Tornado Drill Scheduled Today
