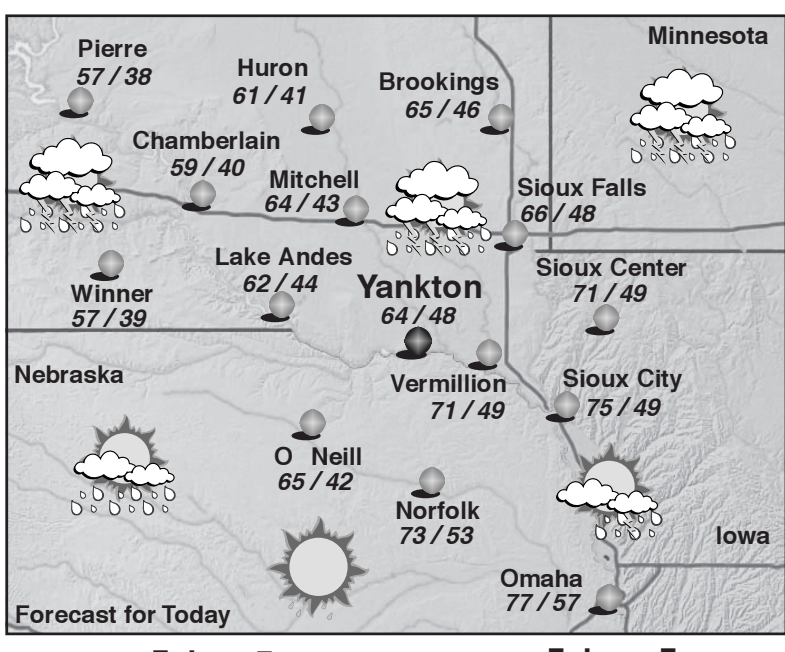

 A billion-dollar housing bill threatened with a presidential veto was the Senate's problem today. The bill's major feature is authorization for the use of as much as one billion dollars to purchase at par mortgages insured by the Federal Housing Administration or Veterans Administration.
