### South Shore Access Point at SRA Closed

LINCOLN, Neb. — The South Shore Lake access point at Lewis and Clark State Recreation Area will be partially closed for improvements beginning April 4, according to the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission. The trail system will remain accessible.

The project includes the construction of two rock jetties to decrease the rate of erosion, provide fish habitat and ensure proper bank stabilization in the area, which has seen significant wave-related shoreline erosion and shale and sediment build-up in the channel. Additional improvements include a new boat dock, ramp and an improved parking facility.

These improvements are funded by the Nebraska Environmental Trust and the Sport Fish Restoration program and are expected to be completed by June 15.

### Developmental Screening Set For Monday

GAYVILLE — Developmental preschool screening for children ages 3 to 5 years (pre-kindergarten) will be conducted on Monday, April 4, at the Gayville-Volin Elementary School.

Children are invited to participate in a free developmental screening for gross motor skills, fine motor skills, communication, concepts, hearing and health. Developmental screening gives information about how your child learns skills that are important in predicting success in school. Preschool teachers, speech/language pathologists, school nurses, administrators and support staff will conduct screening with input from other service agencies.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded higher Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for May delivery jumped 36 cents to \$7.6325 a bushel; May corn gained 30 cents to \$6.9325 a bushel; May oats gained 17.75 cents to \$3.6725 a bushel; while soybeans for May delivery climbed 38.25 cents to \$14.1025 a bushel.

Beef and pork traded mostly higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle edged up 1.40 cent to \$1.1297 a pound; May feeder cattle gained 0.57 cent to \$1.3937 a pound; June lean hogs added 0.72 cent to \$1.0387 a pound; while May pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.1800 a pound.

## Accreditation Open Forums Scheduled For April 4 At USD

VERMILLION — The University of South Dakota will host a forum for public, students, staff and faculty during a visit from a team representing The Higher Learning Commission (HLC) of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

An open forum for the public is at 3:45 p.m. on Monday, April 4 at the Al Neuharth Media Center. A separate forum for students will also be at 3:45 p.m. on April 4 at Beacom Hall 208; while forums for faculty (School of Law courtroom) and staff (Muenster University Center 216) are scheduled for the same date and time in conjunction with the HLC site visit.

The open forums are part of a comprehensive evaluation visit by The Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, April 4-6.

The Higher Learning Commission is one of six accrediting agencies in the United States that provide institutional accreditation on a regional basis. Institutional accreditation evaluates an entire institution and accredits as a whole. The Commission, recognized by the U.S. Department of Education, accredits close to 1,100 institutions of higher education in a 19-state region. USD has been accredited by the Commission since 1913 and was most recently awarded reaccreditation in 2001.

For the past two years, USD has been engaged in a process of self-study, addressing the Commission's requirements and criteria for accreditation. The evaluation team is visiting campus to gather evidence that USD's self-study is thorough and accurate. At the conclusion of its visit, the team will recommend to the Commission a continuing status for the college. Following a review process, the commission itself will take the final action.
