Labor Department Awards RTEC \$100,000 For Green Jobs Training

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Labor (DOL) has awarded \$100,000 to Regional Technical Education Center (RTEC) in Yankton as part of a green jobs training grant.

The approved RTEC grant proposal creates an Industrial Maintenance Technology diploma program through Mitchell Technical Institute (MTI) unique to South Dakota.

"The purpose of the grant is to teach workers the skills required in emerging energy efficiency and renewable energy industries," said State Labor Secretary Pam Roberts. "This will increase the opportunities for unemployed and dislocated workers to move into high-wage and high-growth occupations."

All grant activities must lead to employment and teach competencies demanded by the target sector while supporting participants' long-term career growth. A survey of businesses in the 60-mile radius of Yankton showed proven demand for sustainability of the program.

"This is an exciting partnership and program for the Yankton community and workforce," said RTEC General Manager Josh Svatos. "We are recruiting the first class which starts in August 2011. If someone is interested, they need to contact RTEC as soon as possible."

RTEC and MTI together contributed \$230,000 for startup expenses. MTI instructors will teach the Industrial Maintenance Technology program building upon MTI's existing Energy Star curriculum. Students will also learn the overall concepts of industrial machinery maintenance.

In addition, the program introduces Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) curriculum to provide students LEED certification. The LEED courses will focus on renewable green energy options for industry including geothermal, photo thermal, photovoltaic and air-to-air exchange.

South Dakota received \$2.5 million for the State Energy Sector Partnerships and Training Grant authorized by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. To learn more about job training opportunities available through DOL, visit www.sdjobs.org.

home that morning and still was 105 at the hospital — they said they would not be able to use her organs, but they would be able to use her corneas. It was just like, 'Take them.' I know that is what Megan would have wanted. If she could help somebody else, she would do it in a heartbeat."

Organ and tissue donation is a gift that saves and heals thousands of lives each year, explained Cary Wencil, from LifeSource, the agency that handles all organ donations in South Dakota. The only exception is the Lions Eyebank, which is responsible for donations dealing with eyes.

During a presentation to the Yankton Interagency meeting recently, Wencil explained that it is a gift that relies on the generosity of others — even with the best in medicine and technology, transplantation

is not possible without one person giving selflessly to another.

"Everyone assumes that everyone can be an organ donor," he said. "That is just not true. In all of South Dakota last year, there were only 21 organ donors. There are so many different criteria that must be met. The key one being the patient must be brain dead."

Wencil explained that up to 60 organs can be used from each donor. However, as in cases like Megan's, many times only a few organs can be used.

"Anyone can be a donor, your age or health should not prevent you from registering to be an organ or tissue donor," Wencil said. "Most health conditions do not prevent donation, and age is not a factor — the oldest organ donor was 92."

He stressed that if people want

to be organ donors, they need to make their wishes known.

"When you register to become an organ and tissue donor, you are making a legal decision and, even after your death, your decision will be honored," he said. "It's important to talk with your family to make sure they are prepared to honor your decision at the time of your death. In all honesty, it takes a burden off of your family to make the decision yourself."

Wencil said that as of February, there were more than 110,000 people on national waiting lists, a number that grows every day.

"It is a matter of educating people about donation; that is why April is National Donate Life Month," he said. "The more questions we answer for people, the more information we make available, the more likely people and families will make the decision to donate. It is a gift of life."

Ruth explained that knowing her daughter's gifts will help other people

is a blessing to her family in their time of loss. When she got the call this week telling the Janaks that two people would get the gift of sight because of Megan, she was filled with joy.

"We got the phone call from the Lions Eyebank in Sioux Falls that her corneas would be able to be donated," she said. "Somebody in Sioux Falls was supposed to get one of them and a woman in California would get the other one. They couldn't guarantee me that they would be able to use them on Saturday, but I told them to do what they could. It makes me feel so good that two people get to use them."

Losing their daughter was a shock, but Ruth believes there had to be a reason for it.

"Megan has been a joy to us and absolutely wonderful," she said. "I know it will be sad (not having Megan here), but she was a blessing to us, she taught us so much. Donating is a way for Megan to continue going on."
