The South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) announce the availability of the following Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) for review and comment.

Vermillion River Total Suspended Solids TMDL for Segment R8, Clay, Hutchinson, Lincoln, Turner and Union Counties.

This TMDL was developed in accordance with Section 303(d) of the federal Clean Water Act. The TMDL was developed on a watershed basis that included public involvement.

2010 Legal and Public Notices

TMDLs are an important tool for the management of water quality. The goal of a TMDL is to ensure that waters of the state attain water quality standards and provide designated beneficial uses. A TMDL is defined as "the sum of the individual waste load allocations for point sources and load allocations for both nonpoint source and natural background sources established at a level necessary to achieve compliance with applicable surface water quality standards." In other words, a TMDL identifies the total pollution load of any given water body can receive and still remain healthy. TMDLs are required on waters that do not attain water quality standards or assigned beneficial uses.

Missouri River basin, but well within the channel." Evacuation of stored floodwater will continue through early December. The higher releases will also prevent implementation of the May spring pulse from Gavins Point Dam to benefit the endangered pallid sturgeon. Flows at Omaha and Nebraska City will be above the flow limits due to the higher releases, essentially closing the window of opportunity to run the spring pulse. The downstream flow limits are safeguards to reduce or eliminate the pulse to ensure that it does not cause flooding of agricultural land along the river during the pulse. Mountain snowpack is 116 percent above Fort Peck and 112 percent in the reach between Fort Peck and Garrison. Normally, 96 percent of the peak accumulation of mountain snowpack takes place by April 1. Runoff for 2011 is forecast to total 33.8 million acre feet (MAF), 136 percent of normal. The 2010 total was 38.8 MAF, 156 percent of normal.

continues to hinder any major economic development or growth. Our workers are still making less than those in comparable cities in South Dakota, let alone the nation. We need to eliminate these hurdles, then make certain we have everything in place so that when an economic opportunity presents itself or is located by our Economic Development Commission, we don't lose out to another community. I do not believe subsidizing a business with tax giveaways solves this problem, either. When one can see concrete evidence of positive growth, then I can see justifying spending \$155,827.00 a year towards the Economic Development Commission.

3. Do you have any ideas for cost cuts or savings in the city budget? Are there areas where the city needs to re-prioritize and spend more money?

We must "tighten the belt," budget wide. This should be another major priority of the City Commission. What we save, limit spending on or put into reserves, will help prevent a budget shortfall, i.e. what the state is going through now. We need to reevaluate certain entities that continue to cost taxpayers every year and that don't pull a profit or break even. We need to end taxpayer subsidy of the entities like the airport, for one. We must make these either break-even or profitable or

turn it over or lease it to someone that can. This alone would save over \$170,000 a year. Making steps like these, difficult as they may sound, will ensure that we have surpluses and to ensure that our overall taxes are kept at a minimum.

4. Renovation of the Meridian Bridge into a recreational trail is set to conclude this year. The city has done a lot of planning for the downtown area to prepare for this eventuality. Once the renovation is complete, what steps do you think the city needs to take to capitalize on this unique project?

We need to work closely with the state and the federal government in ensuring that we will continue to have the necessary funds for the upkeep of the Meridian Bridge. Once we are assured that this funding will be available, I believe that we need to tie it in to not only historic downtown Yankton, but Yankton as a whole. I would also like to see perhaps a larger amphitheater put in place, one where we would be able to attract larger entertainment venues, similar to many of the similar-size cities on other major rivers. I would like to see something going on at the river all summer long. It's a great and peaceful and historic place, and one that we are fortunate to have.

5. Any closing thoughts?

If elected to the Yankton City Commission, I will work tirelessly to bring positive economic growth and better economic opportunity for all. I will also make it a priority to be available to all, and I ensure all that if elected, I will be an independent voice of the people, void of any special interest.
