The driver of the second vehicle was transported to Avera Sacred Heart Hospital with life-threatening injuries. Two other individuals were transported to the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. Estimated damage to the northbound vehicle was \$7,350; the turning vehicle sustained about \$9,500 in damage. Police reported that alcohol was a factor in the incident.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded higher Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for May delivery jumped 24.25 cents to \$7.9750 a bushel; May corn added 9 cents to \$7.68 a bushel; May oats climbed 20 cents to \$3.9350 a bushel; while soybeans for May delivery jumped 28.75 cents to \$13.9225 a bushel.

Beef and pork traded lower or flat on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle fell 0.70 cent to \$1.1695 a pound; May feeder cattle fell 0.22 cent to \$1.3550 a pound; June lean hogs added 0.55 cent to \$1.0065 a pound; while May pork bellies gained 1.50 cent at \$1.2150 a pound.
