Press And Dakotan Wins 11 State Awards

BROOKINGS — The *Yankton Press & Dakotan* earned three first place finishes and 11 awards overall in the South Dakota Newspaper Association's Better Newspaper Contest. The awards were presented during the SDNA annual convention Friday in Brookings.

Editor Kelly Hertz received two of those first-place awards, for editorial writing and for feature photo. Hertz also received third in humorous column.

Randy Dockendorf earned first place for best sports column.

Jeremy Hoeck earned two seconds and a third, receiving runner-up finishes in sports series and sports photo, and third in sports reporting.

The *Press & Dakotan* received second place in general excellence. The *Press & Dakotan* also earned third place among all

daily papers for best Public Service Project for its "Spend \$25 locally on the 25th" project, with Shauna Marlette, Lisa Hare and Justin Rust being recognized for their work.

Third place finishes also went to Nathan Johnson in best local interest column and Clay Stoddard in best sports photo.

Several area weekly newspapers were recognized as well.

The *Freeman Courier* earned 12 first place finishes and the Sweepstakes award in the 1,151-2,050 circulation category. The *Courier* also earned two seconds and three thirds.

The *Yankton County Observer* won four firsts, two seconds and a third in the over 2,050 circulation category. One of those firsts was in editorial cartoon, as Jim Anderson beat out cartoonists from both dailies and weeklies.

The *Parkston Advance* earned three firsts and three seconds in the under 1,150 circulation division.

The *Hutchinson Herald* of Menno earned two firsts, a second and three thirds in the under 1,150 circulation division.

which is about 40 miles south-east of Sioux City, about 7:20 p.m. Saturday, National Weather Service meteorologist Van DeWald said. Authorities had no immediate calculation of its intensity.

Frank Boksa, a weather service meteorologist in Johnston, said another tornado touched down near the Sac County town of Early, but there appeared to be little damage.

KCAU-TV in Sioux City

showed footage of gutted buildings, debris scattered across roadways and emergency vehicles with sirens flashing as crews searched the damaged and destroyed buildings.

"We're going door by door to make sure everybody's out," Joe Rodriguez, of Sioux City's Urban Search and Rescue Task Force, told KCAU-TV.

Monana County is in the same region of western Iowa where four Boy Scouts died in a tornado that struck a scouting ranch in June 2008. The National Weather Service said the tornado that hit the 1,800-acre Little Sioux Scout Ranch in the Loess Hills had an estimated wind speed of 145 mph.

Area Responders Have A Busy Weekend

Area emergency providers responded to a pair of rural injury accidents during the weekend.

At about 5 p.m. Saturday, responders from Cedar and Yankton counties to a vehicle rollover just south of the Crofton Golf Course. A north-bound vehicle left the road and rolled into a ravine, ending up on its top. Two people were in the vehicle, one of whom was transported to a Yankton hospital with non-life threatening injuries. The other individual in the vehicle refused transport. The Nebraska State Patrol also responded to the call.

At about 5 a.m. Sunday, Yankton County responders were called to an accident on Highway 81 near the intersection with the Volin road. The driver of a vehicle lost control and rolled into a ditch. There were two occupants in the vehicle, with one person transported to a medical facility with minor injuries.

tried talking to Hines but "it was a very limited conversation."

Paulsen said police confiscated "multiple weapons" from the Willow Lane residence.

"We believe we know which weapon (was used), although we cannot confirm it," the chief said. He did say it was a long-arm weapon.

Paulsen said that no one else is believed to be involved in the incident.

Knoll and Hines "did live together and had dated for several years," Paulsen said. The couple had resided at the Willow Lane address since last July. He said there had been no previous domestic violence calls. "No problems at all, as far as anybody in the area described," Paulsen said.

Charges in the case are still pending, the chief said.

Yankton police were expected to continue reconstructing the scene Sunday as part of the ongoing investigation.

Paulsen said an autopsy will be performed on Knoll today (Monday).
