wounded Hines lying in the front yard. He was still conscious but conversation with authorities was very limited.

Multiple weapons were confiscated from the residence, and Police Chief Brian Paulsen said Saturday that a long-arm weapon found at the scene was believed to have been used to commit the crime.

Knoll's sister, Carly, told KDLT News Sunday that the relationship between Hines and Knoll was troubled.

Knoll had called her father asking for help in the minutes before her death, she said.

"She was trying to leave," Carly said. "She called my dad at 3 a.m. and she said, 'Dad I need help. I need help.' And then it cut off."

Hines was recognized by the City of Yankton in August of last year, along with his uncle, Mark Schlaefli, for their role in helping the Yankton Police Department rescue a man from the Missouri River the previous month. The man had jumped off the Discovery Bridge after evading authorities and nearly drowned.

Funeral services for Knoll are 1 p.m. Thursday at the Wintz & Ray Funeral Home in Yankton with her aunt, Delight Paulson, officiating. Visitation is from 3-8 p.m. Wednesday at the Wintz & Ray Funeral Home in Yankton with a prayer service, video tribute and time of sharing at 7 p.m.

Memorials will be used for the education and support of domestic violence victims.

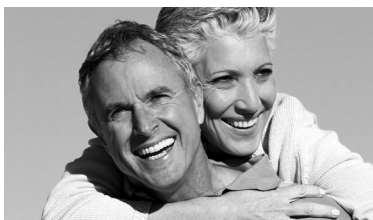
