**New R.C. Univ. Center Building Is Now Open**

RAPID CITY (AP) — The state's higher education system cut the ribbon Tuesday on a new building to house a University Center in Rapid City.

It will offer courses from South Dakota's public universities.

The building cost \$13.4 million and has 26 classrooms, a lecture hall, video conferencing classrooms and seminar rooms.

**S.D. Unemployment Up Slightly In March**

PIERRE (AP) — The federal Bureau of Labor Statistics says South Dakota's preliminary unemployment rate for March was 4.9 percent, up slightly from February's revised 4.8 percent but down from 5.1 percent in March 2010.

State Labor and Regulation Secretary Pam Roberts says that although there has been little fluctuation in South Dakota's jobless rate in recent months, the state's labor force continues to expand.

She says South Dakota's economy continues to gain strength. Last year at this time, the state had an over-the-year loss of 5,200 workers, and this year there's a growth of 2,900 workers.

Nationally, the unemployment rate dropped from 8.9 percent in February to 8.8 percent last month.

**River Dam Near N. Dakota Town At Risk Of Failing**

BURLINGTON, N.D. (AP) — Authorities on Wednesday considered dropping half-ton sandbags from a National Guard helicopter to shore up a dam that stands between 30 endangered homes and the swollen Des Lacs River in northwest North Dakota.

State Homeland Security Director Greg Wilz called it a "crapshoot" because engineers say the sandbags could do more harm than good.

"At this stage of the game, it's more art than science," Wilz said.

About 200 people living near the river had been advised to evacuate because the dam might fail, leading to a 2-foot to 3-foot rise on the river.

After touring the area, Gov. Jack Dalrymple said he was "amazed" at the flooding conditions.

"I wish we could say with certainty what's going to happen in the next day or so," he told worried residents in a packed Burlington city hall.

The National Weather Service issued a flash flood watch for the area on the west edge of Burlington, a city of about 1,200 people, saying a dam failure could lead to a 2-foot to 3-foot rise in the river.

Assistant Police Chief Bill Hunt said he was not aware of anyone leaving their home yet, and that officials in a boat already have rescued one person whose home was surrounded by floodwaters.

Authorities placed a video camera on the dam to monitor water levels and were prepared to immediately contact affected residents if the structure burst.

It was a marked shift west for the North Dakota flood fight, after authorities in the Fargo area reported floodwaters were slowly dropping in rural areas hit with unprecedented overland flooding. Officials were quickly building up dikes in Valley City, about west of Fargo, where the Sheyenne River was coming in higher and faster than expected.

The dirt-and-rock Burlington Dam No. 1 was built in the 1930s to help control the river's flow as it meets the Souris River and flows around Burlington. Authorities have been trying to plug holes in the dam with sandbags but can no longer access the site for safety reasons.

**Man Sentenced For Child Porn Conviction**

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — A 40-year-old Omaha man has been sentenced to seven years in federal prison for receiving and trying to distribute child pornography.

Gary McGaa was sentenced Monday in U.S. District Court in Omaha for a count of receipt and attempted distribution of child pornography.

Upon his release, McGaa will have to register as a sex offender and will be restricted in his access to children and places where children gather.

State and federal investigators testified that they found child pornography videos on a computer hard drive, USB drive and a CD in McGaa's home.

Investigators discovered McGaa's activities through investigation as part of the Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation.

**Heineman Opposes City Sales Tax Proposal**

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — Gov. Dave Heineman says he opposes a legislative proposal that would let cities raise their sales tax rates as high as 2 percent if they receive voter approval.

Heineman told reporters Wednesday that lawmakers who voted to advance the measure are enabling a possible tax increase that would hurt middle- and low-income families. The governor repeated his argument that cities ought to cut spending to balance their budgets.

The sales tax measure (LB357) won first-round legislative approval on Tuesday, 27-14. Overriding a veto would require at least 30 of the 49 senators in the one-house Legislature.

The bill would let cities use the money for local projects or property tax reductions, if approved. Heineman said citizens should instead have the chance for an up-or-down vote on lowering property taxes.

**Sully County Sheriff Pleads Guilty To DUI**

ONIDA (AP) — Sully County Sheriff Bill Stahl pleaded guilty Wednesday to driving under the influence and apologized for disgracing his profession.

Judge Kathleen Trandahl said she considered sentencing him to 90 days in jail. Instead, she suspended a 30-day jail sentence, ordered him to perform 40 hours of community service, and directed him to write a letter of apology to a deputy sheriff and Highway Patrol trooper who arrested him Jan. 22 near Onida.

Trandahl said Stahl was rude, uncooperative and resisted being handcuffed.

KCCR radio reported his blood alcohol content was 0.17. The legal limit for driving is 0.08.

For 30 days he must be tested daily for alcohol use as part of the 24/7 Sobriety Program or wear a bracelet that detects alcohol.
