Renderings Of Expanded Nebraska Stadium Revealed

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — Architects' renderings of the planned expansion at Memorial Stadium show the east side of the venue soaring more than 100 feet, matching the west side.

According to the plans released late Wednesday, the \$63.5 million project will expand the stadium's capacity to about 91,000. Some 6,000 seats will be added to the east side of the stadium, including 3,000 general seats, 2,000 club seats and roughly another 1,000 that could fit in skybox suites.

The expansion will help satisfy a higher demand for seats and allow for future growth as the school enters the Big Ten conference, UNL athletic department officials have said.

The Lincoln Journal Star reports that Nebraska Athletic Director Tom Osborne thinks the university could sell about 500 of the new upper-deck seats to fans from visiting teams. The Huskers are required by the Big Ten to provide about 3,000 seats for visiting fans.

Osborne also said the new seats will be wider, have chair backs and more leg room than in other parts of the stadium.

"That will open up some other seating within the stadium, some of the better seats available," Osborne told the newspaper. "But it will be pretty good seating."

The expansion is set to be completed by the 2013 football season.

Four Past Winners Try For Indy

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Four Indianapolis 500 winners will try to qualify for this year's race.

There are 35 driver-car combinations listed among the entrants for the race's centennial celebration. The 83-car list is the highest since 2002.

Past winners trying to make this year's traditional 33-car field are three-time winner Helio Castroneves, two-time winner and defending champ Dario Franchitti and former series points champs Scott Dixon and Dan Wheldon.

The first woman to ever lead the race, Danica Patrick, is one of three women hoping to qualify. Five rookies also will attempt to make the field, and 18 of the 35 drivers have one at least one victory in open-wheel racing.

ST. PIERRE — Former Wagner standout Solomon St. Pierre will attend the University of Sioux Falls and play football for the Cougars, the institution announced Thursday. St. Pierre, a 5-11, 175-pound standout who the Cougars project at defensive back, recorded a state-record 22 interceptions for his career, as well as 106 tackles. Offensively, he finished his

career with 40 catches for 708 yards and 54 carries for 574 yards. He also averaged 19 yards per punt return and 33.3 yards per kickoff return. St. Pierre earned letters in football, basketball and track. He was a two-time all-state selection in football, and a two-time all-conference selection in basketball. USF announced four other signings Thursday, including

three transfers from the University of Nebraska-Omaha: offensive lineman J.T. Surgent and defensive linemen Derek Delaney and Jarrett Grabbe. Jeremiah Hunter, a freshman receiver from Cheyenne, Wyo., East, also signed for the Cougars. USF's recruiting class for the 2011 season, its first in the transition to NCAA Division II, stands at 24 signees.

Vermillion's Katie Kost is tied for seventh in the girls' 100-124 division with a 688.

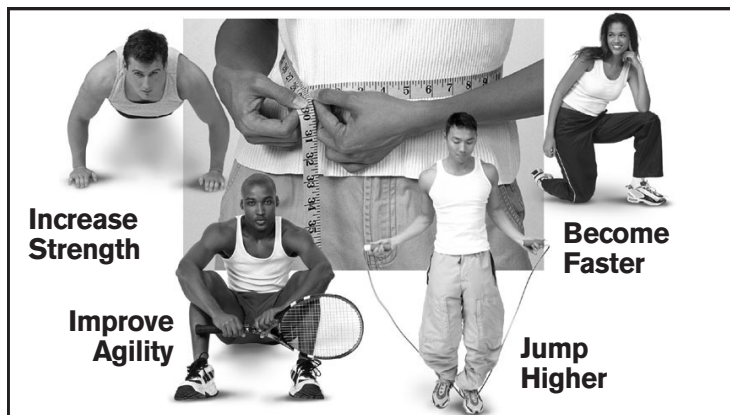
