Completion of the first "farm fuel refinery" in the United States, a plant to manufacture 10,000 gallons daily of "power alcohol" from farm crops has been announced at a meeting of the Atchison, Kas., Chamber of Commerce.

Yankton schools will close for the summer vacation on June 5. This was decided at a meeting of the board of education held yesterday afternoon at which the proposition was gone into an earlier action of the board rescinded. At a regular meeting of the board held Monday night, a letter from the state school authorities was read in which it was announced that schools do not need to make up time lost last winter due to Arctic temperatures, snow-blockaded highways and railroads, and fuel shortages.
