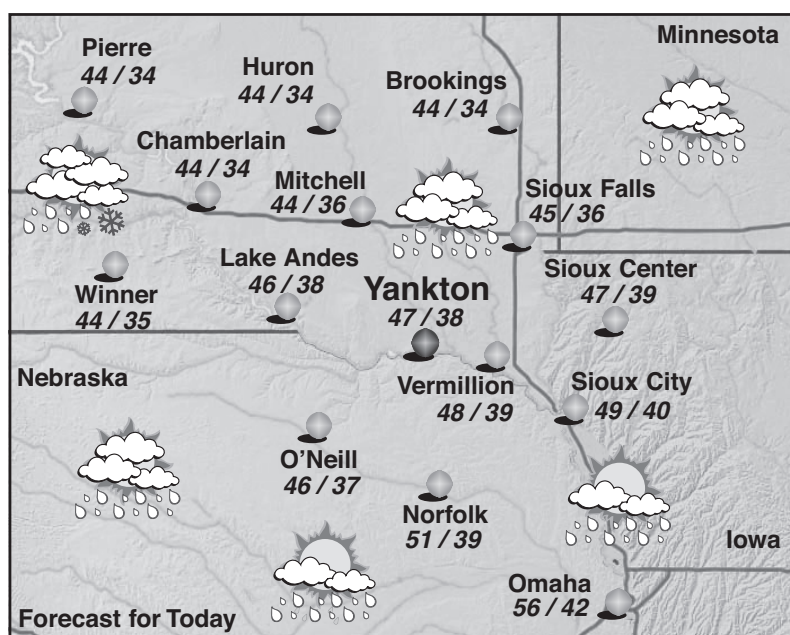

### Grandparent Scam Targets South Dakota

PIERRE — Attorney General Marty Jackley is warning South Dakota seniors to be cautious if they receive telephone calls from someone who claims to be their grandchild and requests money for a critical situation. In this reoccurring scam, a fraudster calls an elderly individual and poses as a grandchild. The person calling uses a plea for help and a sense of urgency when asking for a wire transfer in amounts up to \$6,500. Here are some tips to remember to avoid becoming a victim:

- Ask several personal questions including something that only a grandchild would be able to answer like a nickname, name of a family pet or special family tradition. This will help determine if this is a fraud or not.
- Don't hesitate to call another family member or the grandchild directly with a number that is familiar to you.
- Do not fill in the blanks for the caller. If the caller says, "This is your granddaughter," ask "which one?" or "where are you calling from?" The caller is looking for answers that will assist them in the scam.
- Be cautious if the caller asks you to not tell anyone else, like the parents, because he or she will get in trouble. It is all part of the scam.

The primary reasons for supporting tobacco-free parks are the health risks related to exposure to secondhand smoke, the peer influence on our youth through role modeling, and the environmental impact due to littering. Yankton's city parks and recreational facilities promote health and wellness. The city parks have a tremendous number of young people utilizing them. Positive role models are needed in the parks for youth and the best way for us to influence them is by setting good examples. The environmental impact of leaving cigarette butts on the ground is of concern also. Cigarette butts on the ground are unsightly and take away from the beauty of our parks just as any litter does. There are also the potentially deadly effects on toddlers if the butts are ingested. Do your part to keep the parks tobacco- and litter-free.

## PUC Warns S.D. Consumers Of Scam

PIERRE — The South Dakota Public Utilities Commission is warning consumers of a check scam that improperly uses the name of NorthWestern Energy. The PUC heard from NorthWestern Energy officials who have been contacted by individuals from east coast states inquiring about the scam and checks with the company's name issued as part of a consumer survey effort. Recipients are given instructions on cashing \$2,650 checks as a means to test consumer service. The checks and a letter

instructing consumers regarding the survey are being delivered via FedEx. The letter directs consumers to deposit the funds in a personal account and wire a portion of the funds to a specific family member. The consumers are to follow up by submitting detailed information to "Marketing Alts. Inc." "This scam is particularly unsettling because it uses the name of a South Dakota utility company," said PUC Chairman Steve Kolbeck. "Consumers are used to receiving official and legitimate communications from

their utility providers. "Certainly, this scam is neither. Consumers should check with the PUC or their utility company if they suspect they have received a questionable offer," he added. Any South Dakota consumer contacted with such an offer is cautioned not to deposit the check, but instead, report the facts to the PUC Consumer Affairs Division by calling toll-free 1-800-332-1782 or sending an email to [pucconsumerinfo@state.sd.us](mailto:pucconsumerinfo@state.sd.us).
