would have had children from Russia, from Arabia, you name it. There were occasions because of the state hospital, when professionals came here to work, but the children usually spoke English. That is changing and is raising the issue of how to teach English Language Learners (ELL)."

The issue of how to teach ELL students is a growing national debate. Do you use whole classroom immersion or do you teach them in the students' native languages? In the Yankton School District, immersion basically wins, said Wentworth.

Also, because the Yankton School District does not currently have 50 ELL students, it does not qualify for federal funding. The district must cover the costs based on the general education fund.

"We have been working to get a migrant education program started in Yankton," Wentworth said. "It would provide a grant that would give us more freedom in helping educate not only the children, but also the parents. Being able to provide extra support for students, even at the home where we can even help educate the parents, is a huge component to teaching ELL. Many times, the children become the interpreters for the parents."

Often the first hurdle for the district is helping to identify the student as an ELL student.

"Whenever a child comes to school — every child, not just non-English speaking — their parents must fill out a home language survey," Wentworth said. "If the home language is not English, the child will be considered an English Language Learner and will be given a test to see where their English skills fall. What we can't change is that the child's nationality or race is

whatever their parent says it is. So, you might be looking at a student and think a child may look to be predominately black but the parents list them as white, then we have to list them as white."

Once the student has been identified as ELL, testing must be done.

"If one or most of the question are answered something other than English, then we immediately have to give them the identifier test that the state has adopted," Ryken said. "We have a staff member that has 30 days to get the test done if a student starts at the beginning of the year. If they enter in the middle of the school year, we have two weeks."

If the student has transferred from another state that uses the same test as the state of South Dakota then the records of the students do not have to be recreated. If they are not available, the testing must be completed.

"Age makes a huge difference," Ryken said. "The younger students are a lot easier to teach a second language to than middle school- or high school-aged stu-
