2 Workers Die In Iowa Freight Train Collision

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP) — A coal train rear-ended a train carrying maintenance equipment in western Iowa on Sunday, killing two crew members and shutting down the tracks.

Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway spokesman Gus Melonas said both trains were headed east when the accident happened about 7 a.m. in McPherson, about 45 miles southeast of Council Bluffs. The coal train had been going from the Powder River Basin in Wyoming to Chicago with 130 loads of coal. The fuel was to be transferred to another line in Chicago to be sent to an Eastern utility, he said.

The other train was hauling 34 cars of maintenance equipment belonging to the railroad from Bridgeport, Neb., to Creston, Iowa, Melonas said. Both trains had two-person crews.

The conductor and engineer on the coal train were killed, Melonas said. The crew on the other train was not injured.

"This is an extremely tragic situation for everyone involved," he said.

He did not release the names of the people who were killed.

Initial reports indicate 10 cars on the maintenance train derailed as well as one of the three locomotives on the coal train, Melonas said. Some cars are on their sides, and maintenance equipment

New USD Logo Aims For National Exposure

VERMILLION (AP) — A new-look logo for the University of South Dakota was submitted for trademark approval recently with what school officials hope becomes a widespread rebranding of the institution, as well as its Division I athletic department.

The "U." logo era at USD, which began in 2002, is coming to a close. The proposed "SD" will represent the entire school but get most of its play publicly in athletics, with the state's initials prominently featured to an extent that they had not been with previous logos.

"We feel like we need a logo that has a national appeal," USD marketing vice president Jeff Baylor said. "We want it to represent a flagship institution on a national and global stage."

Initially administrators expected to have an official unveiling before the 2012-13 school year, but they decided on keeping the process a more public one, short on dramatics.

"We want to be able to show people how we got here," USD athletic director David Saylor said. "If we were to try to keep it quiet and pull a curtain on something in August, I think people would feel left out."

Officials have been working with Sioux Falls advertising firm Lawrence & Schiller in search of an appropriate symbol. USD officials say they went into the process with a clear idea of what they wanted.

"There are different approaches you can take on a process like this," said Bob Fitzpatrick, USD's director of marketing. "But at some point, you see something that looks like it's been around a long time, and it looks like it's going to last a long time. We don't want to have a conversation two or three years from now and say, 'Gee, we should be doing something else.'"

Pat Schroeder, a Sioux Falls lawyer and 1976 USD alum who is a member of the "Howling Pack" booster club, gave the new logo a positive review.

"It's definitely better than the one they had," Schroeder said. "It takes me back to when a lot of the teams' uniforms had the 'SD' letters on them, so this is something new that also has some tradition."

School Considers Security After Shooting

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — An Omaha high school is considering security upgrades after a shooting that killed an administrator and wounded another.

Among the options under consideration at Millard South High School are requiring students to stay on campus for lunch, use mesh backpacks, carry an ID badge and ban cellphones.

Police: Neb. Man Fled Amid Investigation

NORTH PLATTE, Neb. (AP) — Authorities are looking for a Hershey man believed to have fled after being charged with sexually assaulting children.

Lincoln County sheriff Jerome Kramer told the North Platte Telegraph that 43-year-old Daniel Fischer is considered a fugitive. Fischer was charged April 4 with three counts of sexual assault of children and released on bond. When officers went to arrest him Wednesday on another charge, they couldn't find him.

Documents filed by police in Lincoln County Court says five girls ages 7 to 15 reported being assaulted by Fischer at his home. The filing says some of the assaults happened last May.

Fischer's wife, 38-year-old Deanna, has been charged with child abuse. Authorities say she photographed some of the assaults. A message left Sunday for their attorney wasn't immediately returned.

Nebraska Man Sentenced In Robberies

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — A man imprisoned in Wyoming for shooting a trooper in the face was sentenced this past week in Nebraska in two armed robberies that started his 1999 crime spree.

Michael Bilderback, 34, formerly of Lincoln, was ordered Thursday in Lancaster County District Court to serve two to four years for robbery, the Lincoln Journal Star reported. But the judge ordered the sentence to run concurrent or during the same time as Bilderback's prison term in Wyoming. He's serving 50 years to life in that state for second-degree attempted murder.

Bilderback confessed to the robberies in 1999 but wasn't brought back to Nebraska to face charges until December. He pleaded guilty in March and apologized during Thursday's hearing for the crimes. Authorities have said he was armed with a gun when he robbed two convenience stores in Lincoln in January 1999, making off with \$650.

"I'm no longer the impulsive, violent kid that I was," Bilderback told the judge.

Neb. Libertarian Named To Committee

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — The communications director for the Nebraska Libertarians has been named to the party's national committee.

State party chairman Gene Siadek says Randy Eshelman was elected Saturday to fill one of two vacant at-large seats on the Libertarian National Committee.

Siadek says the appointment is indicative of both Eshelman's hard work and the growth of the party in Nebraska. Eshelman has been communication director for the past three years.

GF&P Taking Hunter Feedback

PIERRE (AP) — The state's wildlife managers are collecting information from hunters about their effort and success in South Dakota's hunting seasons.

The Game, Fish and Parks Department sent surveys to a sample of hunters in most seasons. The department uses the information to estimate hunter success rates, how much time they spent hunting, and population estimates for different species.

Wildlife biologist Corey Huxoll said hunters who haven't returned their survey card or answered questions on a website still have time to provide data.
