## Lancer Women 10th At Third GPAC Golf Qualifier

HASTINGS, Neb. — The Mount Marty College women posted the tenth-best round of the day during the third Great Plains Athletic Conference qualifier, held Monday at Southern Hills Country Club in Hastings, Neb.

Dakota Wesleyan shot a 336 to edge Midland by one stroke for low round of the day.

Through three of four rounds, DWU holds a three-stroke lead on Midland and a 14-stroke edge on Northwestern.

Mount Marty had the 10th-best round of the day with a 388. The Lancers currently sit in ninth through three rounds, 30 strokes behind Hastings for eighth and four strokes ahead of tenth place Doane.

DWU's Danielle Bellet extended her tournament lead, shooting an even-par 72 to win Monday's medalist honors.

Through three rounds, she holds a 15-stroke lead on Maggie Achterhof-Lezoboom of Northwestern.

Abby Bollinger led Mount Marty with a round of 91. Caitlyn Roth (Tripp) shot 93, Kaylea Karst carded a 99, Michaela Rausch shot 105 and Emily Jo Bronemann shot 120 for the Lancers.

Through three rounds, Roth leads the Lancers at 284, ranking 27th. Bollinger ranks 28th, one stroke behind Roth.

The fourth and final GPAC Women's Qualifier will be played on April 30 in Yankton, at Fox Run Golf Course.

## Kenyan Wins Boston Marathon In Record 2:03:02

BOSTON (AP) — Kenya's Geoffrey Mutai ran the fastest 26.2 miles in history to win the Boston Marathon on Monday. Then his claim to a world record was swallowed up by the hills.

Not the inclines of Heartbreak Hill that have doomed so many runners before him.

It was the downhill part of the race that makes his time of 2 hours, 3 minutes, 2 seconds ineligible for an official world record. In short: IAAF rules have deemed the oldest and most prestigious marathon in the world — long considered the one of the most difficult, too — to be too easy. "You don't look at world records. You just go," Mutai said. "If you are strong, you push it. But if you put it in your head, you can't make it."

Mutai outprinted Moses Mosop down Boylston Street to win by four seconds as the two Kenyans both beat Haile Gebreselassie's sanctioned world record of 2:03:59. Four men, including third-place finisher Gebregziabher Gebremariam of Ethiopia and American Ryan Hall, broke the course record of 2:05:52 set just last year by Robert Kiprono Cheruiyot.

"These guys obviously showed us what's possible for the marathon," said Hall, whose 2:04:58

is the fastest ever run by an American. "I was out there running, and I was thinking to myself, 'I can't believe this is happening right now. I'm running a 2:04 pace, and I can't even see the leaders.' It was unreal."

The IAAF must certify a world record, and it is unlikely to approve Mutai's feat. The international governing body's Rule 206 requires courses to start and finish near the same point in order to discourage downhill, wind-aided runs and the artificially fast times they can produce. (Boston has a net decline of 459 feet, though the course is dominated by hills going up and down.)

### Augie Adds D-I Men's Hoops Recruit

SIOUX FALLS — Augustana head men's basketball coach Tom Billeter announced Monday that Drae Murray will transfer from Division I Sam Houston State to Augustana for the 2011-12 season. Murray will have one season of eligibility remaining.

A native of Huntsville, Texas, and a 2008 graduate of Huntsville High School, Murray has spent the past three seasons at SHSU, where he started 26 games at point guard as a junior last season. He averaged 5.8 points, 4.7 assists and 2.5

rebounds per game. The 5-foot-8 guard had three double-figure assist and five double-figure scoring performances and was second in the Southland Conference in assists with 5.2 per contest in 2010-11.

Murray's three-year career at SHSU saw him score 479 points, hand out 324 assists and grab 173 rebounds. He has a career average of 3.4 assists per game.

Murray was an all-district and all-region first team selection in high school and averaged 16.1 points and 5.2 assists per game during his senior campaign. The District 18-4A Most Valuable Player also shot 54.5 percent from the floor and 43.6 percent from behind the arc as a senior.

"Drae is an experienced point guard who has the ability to break down defenses and distribute the ball, yet he is also able to make baskets," Billeter said. "He has played against some of the better talent in the country and comes into a situation where he is surrounded by some very good scorers.
