is with their personal safety." The lake is far from seeing the worst of its damage, as it will drain slowly, he said. "The longer we go, the more potential for waves to do damage," Schaefer said. Emergency management officials in Codington and Hamlin counties are setting up a one-day joint call center to receive information from citizens about flood damage to their homes. The center will take calls Wednesday from 1 p.m. to 9 p.m. and help officials in the two counties assess the amount and type of damage to private home from spring flooding. The number is (605) 882-6272. Sections of three state highways remained closed Tuesday due to water over the roadway, according to the state Department of Transportation.

Closed highways included Highway 21 at Lake Marsh, between mile markers 125 and 127; Highway 22, east of Hazel, between mile markers 336 and 338; and Highway 42, from the junction at U.S. 281 east, between mile markers 280 and 285. U.S. Highway 81 at Lake Pointsett, between mile markers 132 and 133, and Highway 28 at the northeast corner of Lake Pointsett, between mile markers 346 and 348, are closed to cars, but trucks are allowed to pass. Water was over Highway 28, 3 1/2 miles west of Lake Norden, and Highway 44 east of Parkston Tuesday, but those roads remained open to traffic. Gillispie said things should start to dry out and warm up by Friday. "It's going to be kind of a wet, cold week," he said. "It doesn't look like any huge amounts of rain or snow coming across eastern South Dakota, but there's going to be kind of this light rain off and on through the rest of the week."

Auld-Brokaw Trail Closed Due To Flooding

The Yankton Department of Parks and Recreation advises the community that the Auld-Brokaw Trail, at all low-water crossings and under bridges, will be closed due to flooding caused by the spring thaw and recent rainfall. Citizens should not enter the water because of strong currents and unstable footing. Also, as the water recedes, the trail will be dangerous in any areas where mud, silt and debris are covering the concrete. If the temperatures drop below freezing, wet areas will freeze causing ice on the concrete. The Park and Recreation Department will monitor the water levels, and will clean and open the trail when the water is back into the channel. Throughout this spring season, any time precipitation is forecasted, the public is advised to approach all low-water crossings and under the bridges with caution due to rising water levels.
