Free Events Offered For Prescription Drug Collection

The Northeast Nebraska RC&D and local law enforcement have teamed up to offer citizens the opportunity to properly dispose of unwanted, outdated, or unused prescription drugs. These are free events and are being done through the Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration's National Take Back Initiative. The event is April 30, running from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the following local sites: Antelope County Sheriff's office at 205 E. 6th St., Neligh; Knox County Courthouse, 206 Main St., Center; RC&D Office at 702 E. Park Ave., Plainview; and Cedar County Courthouse's north side on Centre St., Hartington. This nationwide effort addresses a major public safety and health issue. According to 2009 national substance abuse and mental health surveys on drug use and health, more than 7 million people abuse prescription drugs. Teens are big offenders — using these drugs to get high for the first time. Studies have shown that most who abuse prescription drugs get them from family and friends, including the medicine cabinet at home. In the past citizens, law enforcement and institutions have been told to "flush" those types of drugs, but that thinking has changed since medicines have been found in drinking water in some locations around the country. Proper disposal, which is being provided through this National Take Back Initiative, is one of the best ways to handle these substances.
