reduce the risk of high blood pressure, diabetes, colon cancer and coronary heart disease. It also helps control weight, improve overall quality of life and reduce symptoms of anxiety and depression.

Federal health guidelines recommend adults get at least 150 minutes of moderate-intensity physical activity each week, or 75 minutes of vigorous-intensity activity per week.

"Many South Dakota communities have started on the path to wellness and a healthy lifestyle by establishing walking, hiking and biking trails," said Linda Ahrendt, administrator of Health Promotion for the

Department of Health. "These markers and signs are a great way to recognize those trails and promote their use."

In addition to promoting a healthy lifestyle, Larson said the trail system also provides an avenue for alternative modes of transportation.

"Gas prices are going up," he stated. "Hopefully, we'll see more people walking and bicycling. It's not just recreation. Transportation is important, also."

If visions of a trail on the Nebraska side of the Missouri River that would tie into the Auld-Brokaw Trail come to fruition, Larson said the markers will become even more vital for visitors attempting to navigate the system.

"The signs are that much more important under those circumstances," he said.

## Property Tax Breaks Available For South Dakota Paraplegics

PIERRE — Eligible paraplegics in South Dakota can get a break on property taxes through two programs offered by the Property and Special Taxes Division of the Department of Revenue.

Applications for the Property Tax Reduction for Paraplegics Program and the Property Tax Exemption for Paraplegic Veterans Program are now available.

Under the Property Tax Reduction for Paraplegics Program, qualified applicants can have their property taxes reduced on a graduated scale, based on their incomes.

The Property Tax Exemption for Paraplegic Veterans Program completely exempts a qualified individual's property from taxes. There are no income limits for this program, and the accident or injury causing the paraplegia does not have to be related to the veteran's military service.

For both programs, paraplegics are defined as those with

1905 building at Fourth and Walnut streets. According to Yankton Community Development Director Dave Mingo, he received a copy of correspondence addressed to the Yankton County Historical Society requesting comment on the process because the site is located in the Yankton Commercial Historic District. The post office is listed as a contributing feature on the National Register of Historic Places.

Mingo states that the USPS has proposed a memorandum of agreement that would assist in mitigating any adverse effects of a transfer of the post office to a private party. The State Historic Preservation Office is being consulted regarding the contents of

the proposed memorandum.

A task force created by the Yankton Area Chamber of Commerce is leading its own effort to find a future use for the facility and has also been in contact with USPS officials.

Nowacki said the search for a downtown contract postal unit (CPU), like the one located in Yankton's Hy-Vee, has so far been unsuccessful. Letters were sent out in January to gauge the interest of the USPS's business contacts in installing a CPU. An information packet was also given to the Chamber in case there were other interested parties not currently known to the USPS.

The USPS estimates a savings of \$1,089,432 over a 10-year period by closing Yankton's downtown post office. That would result from savings in staffing, utilities, maintenance and transportation (between two facilities).
