A public hearing will be held in the BOP Training Room #B15, Becker-Hanson Building, Pierre, South Dakota, on May 25, 2011, at 8:30 a.m., to consider the adoption and amendment of proposed rules numbered, §§55:01:01:01, 55:01:07:02:02, 55:01:08:02, 55:01:12:05, 55:01:13:04:01, 55:01:15:01:01, 55:01:15:01:02, 55:01:22:01, 55:01:22:02, 55:01:22:02.04, and 55:01:22:19.

The effect of the rule changes would be as follows:

- 55:01:01:01; this amendment would clarify that the definition of "Immediate family" includes step-brothers and step-sisters. Additionally it would clarify that a "Temporary employee" is not entitled to benefits or other status rights.
- 55:01:07:02:02; sets time limits on the length of time that an employee is designated as "severely disabled," for purposes of the disability preference used by the Bureau of Personnel when the appointing authority must interview an applicant.
- 55:01:08:02; revises outdated terminology.
- 55:01:12:05; clarifies that falsifying a time sheet is grounds for disciplinary action even without specific intent.
- 55:01:13:04:01, 55:01:15:01:01, 55:01:15:01:02; clarifies the criteria used in a layoff, the approval process by the Bureau of Personnel and repeals the rule allowing an appeal of a layoff.
- 55:01:22:01, 55:01:22:02, 55:01:22:02.04; updates the terminology relative to the accrual, and allowed use of vacation leave, sick leave and personal leave.
- 55:01:22:19; clarifies that an appointing authority is not required to give prior notice to an employee of a furlough.

The purpose of these changes is to clearly define the definition of a temporary employee, to clarify the disability consideration used by the Bureau of Personnel for identifying when the appointing authority must interview an applicant, to clarify the criteria used in a layoff, and repeat the rule allowing an appeal for a layoff.
