

**St. Helena Man Injured In Tractor Accident**

A rural St. Helena, Neb., man was injured Friday when he became trapped under his tractor after it flipped over in the mud. According to the Yankton Fire Department, the Wynot emergency responders were summoned at approximately 3:10 p.m. Crews had difficulty stabilizing the tractor in the shifting mud, so Yankton emergency crews were called in to assist. Airbags were used to lift the tractor up and extract the victim. The operator of the tractor was transported by air to a Sioux City medical facility. His injuries were unknown.

**SD Soldiers Return Stateside**

VOLK FIELD, Wisc. — Soldiers from the South Dakota Army National Guard's 196th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade stepped off of a plane onto U.S. soil Thursday, April 28 at Volk Field, Wis., after spending one year deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. The Soldiers of the 196th MEB spent the past year operating as an Area Support Group (ASG) command for the Kabul Base Cluster (KBC), improving security and base infrastructure of U.S. and coalition military installations throughout the capital of Kabul. The commander of U.S. and NATO forces in Afghanistan, Gen. David Petraeus thanked the 196th for their accomplishments and hard work during their deployment said Brig. Gen. Theodore Johnson, the 196th commander.

"General Petraeus said himself that he is very proud of us," said Johnson. "There is no question that all nine bases are more secure and the Soldiers have a better quality of life because of our mission." Now that the Soldiers are back in the U.S., they will spend the next several days going through health assessments and paperwork to prepare for release from active federal duty to the South Dakota Army National Guard. "It is phenomenal," said Johnson. "Words can't describe what it feels like landing here in Wisconsin. I have a whole new

appreciation for living in a peaceful country, compared to where we were the past year." When Soldiers are 6,000 miles from loved ones for an entire year, they tend to visualize what they will do when they finally reunite with their family, said Staff Sgt. Robert Schmidt, a member of the general's movement and personal security detail team while in Afghanistan. "I have been visualizing my homecoming since the day we left," said Schmidt. "My 4-year-old said she is going to give me my first hug. My 5-month-old will get my second and my wife will get the last hug. I am very excited to see my family." The 196th MEB will have a welcome home ceremony date, time and location to be determined.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded higher Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for July delivery jumped 23.75 cents to \$8.0125 a bushel; July corn rose 27.25 cents to \$7.5650 a bushel; July oats were up 2.50 cents to \$3.5250 a bushel; while July soybeans soared 40.50 cents to \$13.94 a bushel. Beef and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle edged up 0.18 cent to \$1.1335 a pound; August feeder edged down 0.17 cent to \$1.3595 a pound; June lean hogs fell 1.28 cent to 95.22 cents a pound; while May pork bellies were unchanged at \$1.2650 a pound.
