

Two Women Struck By Alleged Drunk Driver

Two females were struck by an alleged drunk driver Friday evening, according to the Yankton Police Department. Virginia Larson and her adult daughter, Jill, were standing by their vehicle in the parking lot of JoDean's Steakhouse and

Lounge in the 2800 block of Broadway Avenue when they were struck by a vehicle driven by Daniel Hofer, 41, of Olivet. "The Hofer vehicle, which was pulling a trailer, drove into the parking stall just to the south of the Larson vehicle proceeding east-bound," Sgt. Doug Johnson said. "The trailer struck both Jill and Virginia Larson. Virginia went under the vehicle and was run over by

the tires of the trailer. She received serious injuries to her lower legs." Virginia was transported to the hospital. Jill received medical attention for minor injuries, Johnson said. Hofer was arrested for driving under the influence (second) and vehicular battery.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded mixed Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for May delivery fell 3.75 cents to \$6.57 a bushel; May corn rose 11 cents to \$6.55 a bushel; May oats fell 6.50 cents to \$3.3475 a bushel; while May soybeans rose 18 cents to

\$14.21 a bushel. Beef and pork futures rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. April live cattle rose 0.40 cents to \$1.2085 a pound; May feeder cattle rose 0.30 cent to \$1.4942 a pound; while June lean hogs rose 1.77 cent to 92.17 cents a pound.

- A heavy spring storm, the second in two weeks, bringing sleet, snow and rain to virtually all of South Dakota, disrupted highway and rail traffic today, particularly paralyzed wire communications for a time and stranded motorists.
- Funeral services were held in Springfield Thursday for Mrs. Eleanor Yule, 82, a pioneer of this area who is lived in or near here for more than 50 years. She and her husband began farming near Niobrara in 1879. They had to be evacuated during the Flood of 1881.
