**Win At Plainview**  
PLAINVIEW, Neb. — O'Neill, O'Neill St. Mary's, and Norfolk Catholic each placed in the top three overall winners for both men and women at the Plainview track and field Invitational on Friday.  
In the girls' division O'Neill St. Mary's took first winning three events for a total of 142 points. Jessi Pongratz took first in the discus with 115-5.5 and the shot put with 35-6.75. Emily Everitt took first in the high jump with 5-5. O'Neill, which finished second, won three individual events — Brandi Walters in the 100-meter hurdles (16.60), the 100 (13.30) and the 300-meter Hurdles (48.00). O'Neill also won a relay.  
In the boys' division O'Neill took first, winning seven events and two relays for a total of 128 points. Angel Rodriguez took first in the pole vault with 13-0. Connor Peterson won the 100 with 11.60 and the 200 with 24.20. Brock Schueth grabbed the 400 with a time of 53.60. Derek Hostert placed third in the 3200 with 10:40 and the 1600 with 4:52.80. Tate Laursen took the 300 hurdles with a 41.50.

O'Neill St. Mary's, which finished second, won two events — Tyler Timmerman in the High Jump (6-2) and Kyle Loecker in the Long Jump (20-9).

**Miller Leads Hall Of Fame Class**

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Five-time All-Star Reggie Miller and longtime coach Don Nelson are among a dozen players, coaches and teams that will be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.  
The class of 2012 was announced in New Orleans, the site of the Final Four.  
Also elected were two-time Olympic gold medalist Katrina McClain, three-time college player of the year Kathryn Sampson, four-time NBA champion Jamal Wilkes, longtime referee Hank Nichols, and the All-American Red Heads, the female version of the Harlem Globetrotters.  
Five members of the class had already been announced: Nike co-founder Phil Knight, ABA star Mel Daniels, seven-time NBA All-Star Khris Waller, Olympian Don Barksdale and Lydia Alexeeva, who led the Soviet Union to two Olympic gold medals.  
The class will be inducted Sept. 7 at the Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass.

Koch said. "Right away, I started watching what Will (Powell) does. He's the guy everyone looks to as a receiver."  
The quarterback who will be throwing passes his way. Likely starter Josh Vander Maten spent the bulk of the 2011 season on the scout team with Koch.  
"That helps our chemistry," Koch said. "He knows where I'll be, and I know his style; how he handles himself."  
Even though he wasn't a big part of the offense in last Saturday's first scrimmage, Koch will be a key cog on the 2012 season opens in September, Glenn said.

USD received one starter, but that player — senior center Tim Ross — may find that just because there will be four new faces seeing a bulk of the action

"Everyone will be looking at us like we're the little brother, but we'll surprise people in a big way," Ross said before Monday afternoon's spring practice in Vermillion.  
The Coyotes' 122-1-2 senior Tom Compton (an NFL prospect), R.J. Polley, Brent Johnson and Matt Porisch, not to mention Broc Gullett.  
Those lined up, along with Ross, helped USD finish second in the Great West Conference in rushing offense (158 yards per game) and third in passing offense (177.6).  
"Last year, we were thought of as being one of the best lines to come through here," Ross said. "We had a lot of 3-year starters. Yeah, we'll be young this year, but trust me, we'll be pretty good too."  
Ross pointed to Cody O'Neill, Steve Nelson, Andrew Schofield and Matt Huffer as the next crop of linemen who will guide the offense into the Missouri Valley Football Conference — which USD joins this fall.  
"That's what I was looking forward to, the competition level getting better," Ross said. "We'll never get a week off; we won't have those NAIA teams in here anymore."
