The Yankton School District is in the process of applying for federal funding for the 2012-13 school year under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001. Signed into law by President George W. Bush on Dec. 13, 2002, the statute contains several "titles," two of which are applicable to a district of Yankton's size:

- Title I, Part A = Reading Recovery
- Title II, Part A = Improving teacher quality to fund staff development activities

A major focus in this legislation is parental, student, and community participation in the planning and designing of programs funded using federal education dollars.
