Sayings To Examine This Good Friday

It's Friday, but Sunday's coming!!!

This is the title of the Good Friday sermon preached by Dr. Tony Campolo, an American pastor, sociologist, author and public speaker. He is outspoken and often controversial, but he has made some comments that bear repeating. For example, here is one of his quotes: "I think that Christianity has two empathies. One is a social emphasis to impart the values of the kingdom of God to society — to relieve the sufferings of the poor, to stand up for the oppressed, to be a voice for those who have no voice. The other emphasis is to bring people into a personal, transforming relationship with Christ, where they feel the joy and the love of God in their lives."

This Good Friday sermon, "It's Friday, but Sunday's Coming," appears to be just as effective in communication. Originally attributed to a southern black Baptist preacher, it has become known for the truth of the reality and importance of the resurrection, the hope of all believers in Christ. If Christ had not risen from the dead, we would be of all people most miserable. The cross was an instrument of execution used by the Romans to bring about a punishment most painful and cruel as possible. It represented a curse to the Jews. Written in the Old Testament was such a statement that anyone executed this way had a curse upon him. Written in the New Testament is the following: "Christ has redeemed us from the curse, by being made a curse for us, for it is written, cursed is every man who hangs on a tree.(Galatians 3:13)."

While hanging on the cross, there are recorded in the Gospels seven sayings of Christ as He was suffering, paying for the sins of the whole world (1 John 2:2). His payment is offered as a gift to all who recognize their sin and come to Him by faith receiving this gift. Perhaps, more than anything else, it would be good to examine these sayings at this time.

1st saying: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

Found in the Gospel of Luke (23:34) we immediately apply this to the religious leaders who brought about this execution by forcing the Romans to carry this out. The Jews themselves said let

his blood be upon us and our children, but I believe that it goes much further than that. It falls upon all mankind, who need a savior including you and I.

2nd saying: "Truly I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise."

Also found in the Gospel of Luke, Jesus said this to the repentant thief. There were two thieves crucified, one on each side of Jesus. The other was unrepentant. Repentance means a change of mind. Jesus introduces his statement with the word verily, used in the original language of scripture (koine Greek) to empathize the truth of what He said. In the account of the first family in Genesis, we see a similar situation: two boys were born to Adam and Eve. The younger brother pleased God while the older did not, and murdered his brother. In this account, the first person born into this world became a murderer.

3rd saying: (to Mary) "Behold your son, (To John) Behold Your Mother."

This passage is found in John 19:26-27. There are four believed to be at the foot of the cross, Mary, his mother, John, the disciple whom He loved, Mary of Cleopas, his mother's sister, and Mary Magdalene. The other disciples, disenchanted, had fled and were hiding, fearing for their lives. He had four brothers, named in Mark 6:3 as James and Joses and Judas and Simeon as well as sisters. We read in John 7:5 that "not even his brothers were believing in him." To them he must have been an embarrassment, born to their mother who was pregnant before being married to their father, Joseph, who must have been now deceased. His mother had been in his care, and when he was to die the next oldest brother would take care of her. Since they were not there, he turned to John. After the resurrection the whole picture changed. The brothers were in the upper room at Pentecost along with the disciples and now among the believers. James and Jude would become authors of two of the books in the New Testament.

4th saying: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

This passage, found in Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34 is found in

the opening line of Psalm 22 in the Old Testament. This psalm depicts very graphically the suffering that Jesus endured on the cross. As an instrument of torture, the ancient historian Josephus describes an incident where two men had been on the cross for over thirty hours when they were rescued. One died, but the other lived after all that suffering. Jesus lasted only six hours before he died, with evidence depicting a ruptured heart indicated by the blood and water coming from his side. Dr. Joseph Free, my College professor in his book Archaeology and Bible History points out that there are 332 distinct prophecies that have been literally fulfilled in Christ. The chances of all these prophecies being fulfilled by one man is represented by an amazing fraction, the numerator of which would be one and the denominator represented by a figure written with the number 84 followed by 97 zeros. More people are probably familiar with the 23rd Psalm, opening with "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want."

These two Psalms along with the 24th Psalm form a trilogy beginning with the Suffering Savior, then the shepherding Savior and closing with the Triumphant Savior, the Lord, the King of Glory.

5th saying, "I Thirst."

Here is a human expression of his physical suffering. In Psalm 22:14 and 15 it is written as follows: "I am poured out like water, and my bones are all out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within me. My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue cleaves to my jaws." This is the same Psalm where in the next verse it is written "they pierced my hands and my feet." The reason for his suffering is recorded in the book of Isaiah. A complete copy of this book was found in the Dead Sea scrolls. These were found in 1949 by Bedouin Arabs on the north shore of the Dead Sea. Carbon 14 testing determines the scroll to have existed about 100 years before Christ. The original book is dated to about 700 BC at the time of its composition. As liberal criticism, attempting to deny the inspiration of scripture, tries to make a case that the scroll was written much later. Isaiah 53:4-6 begins with these words: "Surely

he has borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions; he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him, and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all."

6th saying, "It is finished (tetelestai)."

In this word Jesus recognizes that his suffering is over and his task is completed. This word, tetelestai, was also written on business documents or receipts in New Testament times to show indicating that a bill had been paid in full. The connection between receipts and what Christ accomplished is quite clear. He was the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. "God would provide the Lamb" was the promise by Abraham given to Isaac. By faith in obedience to God he intended to slay his son. The angel prevented Abraham from doing this. While Isaac was spared, Jesus was not. Romans 8:31 in commenting on God's relationship to the believer regarding this, "What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us? He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?" All the power of sin and Satan was finished for God's people on the cross.

7th saying: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

Dr. Steven Barabas, my New Testament Introduction Professor at Wheaton College, spoke on this passage in a Good Friday service. Jesus stating this being not only a way to die but also being a way to live! Jesus, who knew no sin, was made sin for us. This Jesus did for us, that we might not perish, but have eternal life. May I ask, what are you doing with Jesus? Romans 8:14 reads "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God." To some, no one is more important than Jesus who gave Himself for them; to others he is no more significant than a dead dog by the side of the road. Here is wisdom: "Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon Him while He is near (Isaiah 55:6)."
