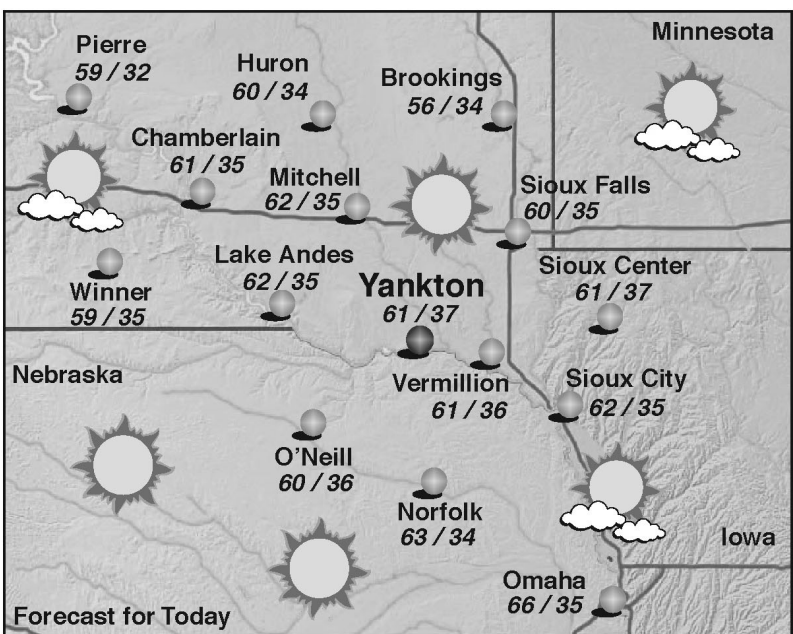

GEAR Center Adds Labs To Accelerate Research

SIOUX FALLS — Researchers and entrepreneurs will soon have access to additional space and resources as they grow their research programs and launch new companies.

Nearly 5,000 square feet of lab and office suites are currently being constructed on the first floor of University of South Dakota's Graduate Education and Applied Research (GEAR) Center. The GEAR Center is located on the University Center campus in Sioux Falls.

The mission of the GEAR Center is to foster economic development by creating an environment where university research and talent connect with entrepreneurs and private sector resources. Currently the GEAR Center is home to USD's Biomedical Engineering program as well as multiple companies working to bring newly developed technologies to market.

"We are excited that the GEAR Center is at capacity and that we needed to build out this additional space," said USD Vice President for Research Dr. Laura Jensi. "The Biomedical Engineering Program has been a success in terms of research funding, graduate student enrollment, and commercialization opportunities and will fill the Center's entire second floor."

Along with specialized space that includes a clean room, dark room, cell and tissue culture suites, GEAR Center tenants also have access to business incubation services of the South Dakota Technology Business Center

(SDTBC). "It's amazing to see how research and commercialization at GEAR has grown and evolved since the facility opened in 2009," said Rich Naser, SDTBC executive director. "We look forward to continuing to work with USD and additional GEAR tenants to help grow research and new companies in South Dakota."

• Yankton is faced by serious problems which urgently call for the consideration that only a central organization like a Chamber of Commerce can give, it was brought out at the open meeting of business and professional men held last night in the restored Territorial Council building at the foot of Broadway.
• The annual meeting of stockholders of the Yankton Production Credit association, which was postponed from January 15 to today because of weather and road conditions is being held in Knights of Columbus hall in Sacred Heart parochial school, with a business session this forenoon and again this afternoon and a dinner served in the dining hall.

50 YEARS AGO
Saturday, April 7, 1962
• In the first three months of 1962, there have been 139 motor vehicle accidents reported in the city of Yankton involving 257 vehicles. Stormy weather and poor driving conditions were a factor in the rash of accidents in February and March. The monthly figures were 33 accidents and 59 vehicles in January, 54 accidents and 100 vehicles in February, and 52 accidents and 98 vehicles in March.
• "It was a rarity among track meets," was the comment from veteran Coach Carl I. Youngworth after Yankton college's triangular win over General Beadle of Madison and Northwestern college of Orange City, Iowa yesterday on Crane field.

25 YEARS AGO
Tuesday, April 7, 1987
• Testimony was heard Monday in Yankton Circuit Court on a rural Tabor couple's proposed change in the west boundary line of the Yankton and Bon Homme School districts. Although Jerry and JoAnn Herman live only one mile from the Bon Homme district's Tabor Elementary School, they reside in the Yankton School District. The couple does not want their three children riding a school bus 17 miles into Yankton each day when the Tabor school is within bike-riding distance.
• Organizers say at least eight Neighborhood Watch groups will be started in Yankton within the next two weeks. Roy Wilcox and Joe Sejnoha told a group of 16 people at an informational meeting Monday that the first steps have been taken to establish a network of such crime-watch groups through the city.
