We Could Always Use More...

Youth Pastor At Calvary Baptist Church In teaching students about what God says about money and possessions, I came across an interesting story. Here 's the brief version: Quite a few years ago, an American company opened up an assembly plant in Panama. The problem they soon ran into was that many of the employees would work for only a short period of time, earn a couple paychecks, and then quit. They weren't quitting because of poor working conditions but they quit because they had all the money they needed. If you were a company executive, how would you hold on to your employees in Panama? Lower their wages? Have them sign a contract?

The solution they came up with was quite interesting. They simply sent their employees a Sears Catalog. Upon opening the catalog, the employees would

find a number of items for sale that they never even knew they needed. The problem was solved. The employees kept working because they needed more money to buy these previously unnecessary items.

We live years later and in a different country but our minds work the same. We could always use more. We're not a very content people. Paul said to the Philippians (4:11) that he had learned the secret of being content. I'm not there yet. Are you?

The Sears Catalog is nothing compared to the barrage of marketing we face daily through the internet, TV, radio, billboards, etc. And we don't just covet what we see advertised, we covet what others have. Your

greener than yours, your sister's kids are better-behaved than yours, and everyone else is happily married while you're not. We are not content.

found that when we finally attained the coveted thing that we thought would make

us content, somehow our attitude quickly reverts to discontentment. Jeremiah Burroughs noticed this back in the 17th century when he noted: "Many men think that when they are troubled and have not got contentment it is because they have but little in the world, and that if they had more they should be content. That is just as if a man were hungry, and to satisfy his craving stomach he should gape

and hold open his mouth to take in the wind, and then should think that the reason why he is not satisfied is because he has not got enough of the wind; no, the reason is because the thing is not suitable to a craving stomach." We swallow a whole lot of wind.

So, what is the solution? The solution is to quit expecting satisfaction to come from a bellyfull of wind and to turn to find our joy and satisfaction in God. Paul said earlier in Philippians that he counted everything as loss compared to the surpassing worth of knowing Christ. The secret of Paul's contentment was that he had gained Christ and been found in Him, not through any righteousness that came from following the law but through faith in Jesus (Phil 3:7-9). May you believe in the sufficiency of Christ and desire Him above all else.

Continuing Education Course Announced

Yankton College, in partnership with Eden Theological Seminary, will offer a pastoral theology course for pastors and lay leaders as part of the Associate degree program at Yankton College. The title of the course is "Faith Formation — Connecting Church and Home: Generation to Generation," and it will be taught by Dr. Diane E. Shallue, Director of Christian Education and Small Group Ministries at University Lutheran Church of Hope in Minneapolis.

This course will explore the strengths and challenges involved in intergenerational learning in congregations and provide skills in using this approach. The first meeting of the class will be May 4-5, and the classes will meet online weekly through June 1. There is a cost for both a credit and an audit. Limited scholarships are available. Students will participate in the Leadership Continuing Education Event for the first class meeting.

The Leadership Continuing Education Event will be held May 4 (1-9 p.m.) and May 5 (8:30 a.m.-noon) at the Chamberlain United Church of Christ, Chamberlain.

The Leadership Continuing Education Event will focus on leadership in Intergenerational Ministries and how to create an intergenerational perspective in a congregation. Models of intergenerational ministry and examples from the personal experience of the presenter as a congregational religious educator will be provided. There is a cost to attend just the Leadership Continuing Education Event. Costs include dinner on Friday, continental breakfast on Saturday, instruction and materials.

Both the Course and the Event will be coordinated by the Rev. Dr. Anita Bradshaw, who also serves as the director for Eden's Judicatory Based Education initiatives, including its partnership in the Yankton College Pastoral Theology program. Dr. Bradshaw has served local congregations as well as faculty at a number of colleges and seminaries.
