S.D. Attorney General Warns Of Telecommunications Scam

PIERRE — Attorney General Marty Jackley warns business owners and government offices to be cautious of solicitations masked as invoices for telecommunications services they did not authorize.

The attorney general's Consumer Protection Division has received numerous calls from businesses and government offices statewide who have received an invoice for \$425 for a "telecom maintenance agreement" from a company believed to be out of California.

"The invoices will serve as future sales pitches from these companies," said Jackley. "Nowhere on these invoices are there disclaimers that explain what their intent will be. These invoices look legitimate and are being paid without question. It is imperative that organizations question the validity prior to submitting payment."

A nine-member committee of the Yankton Sioux tribe met with U. S. government officials at Marty Wednesday, to discuss legal aspects and other details of proposed amendments to a 1932 constitution and by-laws by which the committee is seeking to establish a tribal government for the Yanktons.

Beef and pork futures fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle slipped 0.40 cent to \$1.1545 a pound; May feeder cattle fell 0.17 cent to \$1.5190 a pound; while June lean hogs fell 1.37 cent to 87.40 cents a pound.

May 1 Deadline For Property Tax Homestead Exemptions

PIERRE — Applications for the Property Tax Homestead Exemption Program are now available to eligible property owners who wish to delay payment of their property taxes in South Dakota.

May 1st is the deadline to apply for the program.

Under the state Homestead Exemption, qualified applicants can delay payment of property taxes until their property is sold. Taxes then become a lien on the property and must be paid along with interest before the property can be transferred.

To qualify for the exemption, an applicant must be at least 70 years old or a surviving spouse; have owned a single-family dwelling for at least three years or been a South Dakota resident for at least five years; have resided at least eight months of the past calendar year in a single-family dwelling; and meet the program's income limits.

The maximum amount of income to be eligible is \$16,000 for a single-member household and \$20,000 for a multiple-member household.

The program defines property as the house, garage, and the lot upon which it sits, or one acre, whichever is less. Applicants should be aware that application and qualification for the Homestead Exemption Program make them ineligible for the Senior and Disabled Citizens Sales and Property Tax Refund Program.

Interested individuals must apply annually to their county treasurers for the Property Tax Homestead Exemption Program. Applications are available at county courthouses, the Department of Revenue's Property and Special Taxes Division, or in downloads from the department's Web site at: <http://www.state.sd.us/drr2/forms/propertytaxforms.htm> (see form PT-38C).
