Drainage Commission Applications Available

Yankton County Commissioners are accepting applications for a Drainage Commission to hold public hearings to implement and conduct hearings for the Yankton County Drainage Ordinance.

The drainage commission will consist of nine members to include farmers, rural land owners, hunting organization representatives, conservation representatives, agricultural service representatives, rural community representatives, county commissioners and planning commissioners. The drainage commission will meet once a month to review drainage applications in accordance with the Yankton County Drainage Ordinance and provide recommendations/findings to the Yankton County Commission.

Yankton County Planning & Zoning will provide meeting schedules, clerical work, meeting minutes, publicity arrangements, and other support functions. The Planning & Zoning office will provide a template for proper procedure, recommendations and commission terms.

Renovation Begins On Mo. River Boat Ramp

Construction has begun to renovate the Missouri River boat ramp in the Training Dike Recreation Area below Gavins Point Dam. The ramp will be widened and lengthened to improve launching vessels.

During the renovation the ramp will be closed. There may be delays on the roadway in front of the ramp, which is near Chief White Crane Campground.

Construction is expected to last approximately one month.

Fisherman and Boaters needing access to the river below Gavins Point may use the Nebraska Tailwaters Boat Ramp located just off of Nebraska Highway 121 on the south side of the Missouri River.

Corps To Conduct Spillway Test At Gavins Point Dam

OMAHA, Neb. — The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Omaha District, has scheduled a spillway test for Gavins Point Dam Tuesday, May 1.

The test is scheduled to begin at 6 a.m. when engineers will begin reducing releases from 26,000 cubic feet per second to 12,000 cfs. That process is expected to take two hours. Releases will be held steady at 12,000 cfs for approximately four hours. They will then be increased back to their previous release rate of 26,000 cfs. The return to the previous rate is expected to take two hours. The full test is projected to take eight hours from start to completion.

"Preliminary assessments of damages sustained at Gavins Point Dam project in the aftermath of the Flood of 2011 indicate minor damage to a number of areas on the spillway slab," said John Remus, Chief of the Omaha District Hydrologic Engineering Branch. "This means there is the potential for additional damage to exist below the slab, and in order to assess the situation we need to dewater the upper portion of the spillway slab."

The test will help determine the feasibility of dewatering the upper portions of the spillway slab at the dam. If successful, information gathered from the May 1 test will be used to

develop a future flow reduction schedule that will allow for the needed detailed damage assessments. The future flow reduction is tentatively scheduled to take place during the week of May 7.

The flow reduction will result in the following approximate stage reductions:

- 2.5 feet at Yankton during the afternoon of May 1
- 1.2 feet at Sioux City, Iowa on May 3
- 0.9 feet at Omaha, Neb. on May 4

Stage reductions at Yankton, Sioux City and Omaha are expected to last for approximately six hours, 12 hours and 18 hours, respectively. Stage reductions are expected to be less if tributary inflows below Gavins Point Dam are above current levels.

Minor release adjustments at Fort Randall Dam may be necessary in order to maintain the pool elevation at Gavins Point Dam between May 1-4. Operation of the other Missouri River main stem dam projects will not be impacted.

The Northwestern Division Missouri River Basin Water Management Office and engineers in the Omaha District will monitor the situation closely and make any necessary adjustments to releases.

He enjoyed fishing, going to the casino and playing cards.
