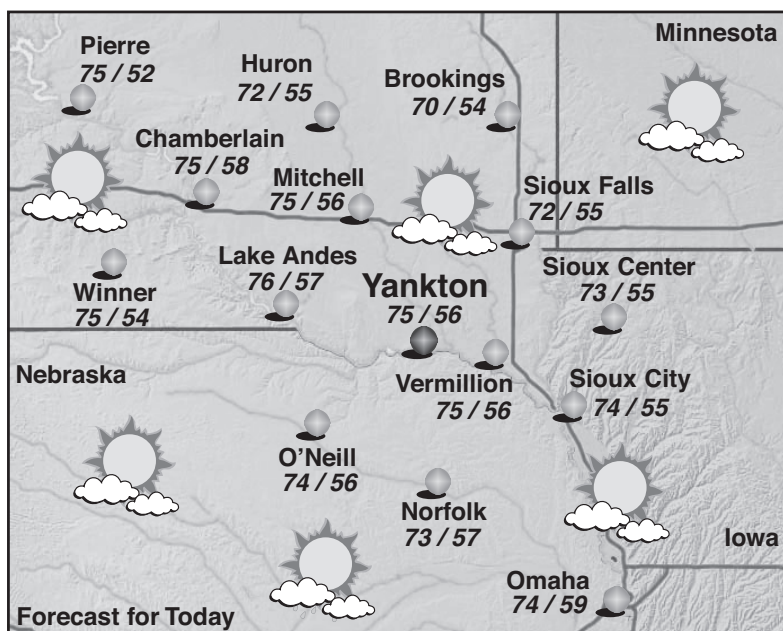

New Nebraska Law Changes DMV Process

LINCOLN, Neb. — The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) reminds Nebraskans that effective May 1, any individual needing a duplicate or replacement driver license or state-issued identification card will begin the application process with the DMV Driver Licensing Staff. LB 751 passed in the 2012 Legislative session changed the point of application from the County Treasurer's Office to the DMV Driver Licensing Office.

The changes were implemented to bring uniformity to the DMV application process. "It makes more sense for applicants for any DMV issued document to begin the process with the DMV staff," said Beverly Neth, Department of Motor Vehicles director. "We want to bring uniformity to the process for applicants and streamline the process to reduce costs associated with training and new technologies."

Neth encourages anyone who needs to obtain a duplicate document to go to the DMV on-line services at www.CLICKDMV.ne.gov. Renewals and duplicates are available through the DMV on-line services. Anyone seeking a name or address change needs to request that service in person.

Grass Clippings Being Accepted Wednesday

The City of Yankton Transfer Station will begin accepting ONLY grass clippings in the evenings from 6-8 p.m. on Wednesday, May 2. Beginning on that date, the Transfer Station will be open on Wednesday evenings until further notice.

Grass clippings may also be taken to the Transfer Station during normal business hours of 8 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

The City of Yankton reminds everyone to keep foreign materials, such as garbage, tree limbs and branches, batteries of all kinds and all other items out of the grass clippings. Empty all leaf and grass bags on the pile and dispose of bags in dumpster next to the grass pile.

here and nationally," he continued. "We must come together in unity and support Republican candidates, even the ones we don't totally agree with. And we must make sure we vote and get out others to vote, as well."

Yankton County Republicans are a good example of party members sticking together, Daugaard said.

"In the general election in Yankton County, (Lt. Gov. Matt Michels, a Yankton resident) and I had a 25 percent margin of victory," he stated. "That's something any elected official would be very pleased to have. Certainly, we're very pleased and grateful to have it."

Daugaard explained how Republicans have become a dominating force in South Dakota politics.

"Look at our numbers today. There are 51 Republicans in the House of Representatives," he said. "That ties the record for the number of Republican representatives in the House. It's the highest number since 1984. That's pretty amazing."

The Senate, Daugaard pointed out, has an even bigger majority.

"We have 30 out of 35 senators that are Republican," he said. "That's the highest number since 1953, the year I was born. I owe my thanks to all of you for making that possible."

Yankton Women Involved In Pierre Crash

A Yankton woman was involved in a car accident Saturday that resulted in the death of a Pierre woman.

According to the South Dakota Highway Patrol, a Ford F350 driven by Walt Taton, 53, of Faith drifted into the eastbound lane of Highway 34 five miles west of Hayes and collided head-on with a 2009 Dodge Caravan driven by Sadie Clark, 21, of Yankton.

The accident occurred at approximately 12:15 a.m. Saturday.

Clark and Taton received serious non-life threatening injuries. The passenger in the Clark vehicle, Heather Unser, 28, of Pierre, received fatal injuries.

Neither Clark nor Unser were wearing seatbelts. They had to be extricated from the vehicle.

Taton was wearing a seatbelt. All three were transported to the Pierre Hospital.

Alcohol is believed to be a factor.

The crash is under investigation and charges are still being determined.

The Haakon Sheriff's Office, Philip Ambulance, and Midland Fire and Rescue assisted at the scene.

The success in Yankton County was duplicated in many other districts across the state. It's the same story of success we've seen not only in elections but also in voter registration.

When Gov. Bill Janklow was first elected in 1978, there were 193,000 registered Democrats and 191,000 registered Republicans.

"As of the first of this month, the number of registered Democrats has decreased from that time to only 186,000," Daugaard said. "They are down 7,000 in registered numbers. Conversely, the number of registered Republicans has increased by 48,000 to 234,000. What an incredible achievement."

He believes Republican leaders such as Janklow and Gov. George Mickelson had a great deal to do with the sea change in party affiliation.

Janklow arranged for the state to purchase railroad tracks, cleared the way for the finance sector and pushed to have South Dakota classrooms wired to the Internet. Mickelson forged many of the state's economic development tools, solved water issues and worked on reconciliation with Native American tribes.

"In a way, they are still with us because of the many things they did that are still with us," Daugaard said.
