Morris admits that the marathon wasn't his first choice. He was thinking further down the line.

"If I wasn't doing this (RiverRat) today, I would probably be out on a 40-mile training run. I like ultra-marathons," Morris said.

For the women, Diane Murphy, 29, got a nice surprise when she not only finished her first marathon, but crossed the line first — winning in a time of 3:41:42.

"I didn't even know I was going to do a marathon until two weeks ago; we were going to do the half, but my friend told me to do the full and I said, 'Why not?,' said Murphy. An exhausted, yet smiling Murphy sees her accomplishment as profound.

"Sometimes you don't know what you can do until you just do it," she said.

Coming in second for the women was Mary Von Seggern of Fremont, Neb.

"The scenery was wonderful. The hill at the end was pretty deadly however," Von Seggern said. Referring to Chalkstone Hill, Von Seggern was accurate in its description. The well-known hill to area runners provides a daunting challenge to an already-tough race.

Both the marathon and half-marathon runners took runners out west of town, flirting with Lewis and Clark Lake, before turning around and coming back up Chalkstone.

And just like the marathon, the half-marathon was won by someone outside of Yankton. Bruce Allen, 48, of Flandreau, finished the Boston Marathon on April 16, only to turn around and compete in RiverRat 2012.

Drake Relays

DES MOINES, Iowa — The University of South Dakota track and field teams broke four school records, including two on Saturday, during the Drake Relays, which concluded Saturday in Des Moines, Iowa.

Alexa Duling had a hand in both records Saturday. She finished 13th in the 400-meter hurdles, clocking a 59.79 to break her old mark by 0.13 seconds. She also teamed with Emma Ladwig (Gayville), Analisa Huschle and Ashley Sveum as the Coyotes finished third in the 1,600-meter sprint medley relay in 3:53.25.

On Friday, the Coyote men's 4x1,600 relay set a school record of 16:59.67. The foursome included sophomore Jeff Mettler, the sophomore Travis Brenner (Yankton), junior Ethan Mar-
