- A heavy April snowstorm brought welcome moisture to soil in this section this morning. Snow which started shortly before 6 o'clock this morning was unusually heavy with moisture. In less than an hour the ground was white with a heavy blanket and snow continued to fall steadily.
- April 30 has been set as the deadline for the payment of old-age benefit taxes for the first quarter of 1938 under the Social Security Act, T. C. Kasper, federal collector of internal revenue for South Dakota announced today. Under new rules inaugurated the first of the year, social security taxes are to be paid every three months instead of every month.

50 YEARS AGO

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures fell Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for May delivery fell 2.50 cents to \$6.94 a bushel; May corn fell 11.5 cents to \$6.30 a bushel; May oats fell 3 cents to \$3.59 a bushel; while May soybeans fell 8.25 cents to \$13.72 a bushel.

Beef and pork prices also fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle fell 0.85 cent to \$1.2235 a pound; May feeder cattle fell 0.62 cent to \$1.4595 a pound; June lean hogs fell 0.45 cent to 92.02 cents a pound.
