MMC To Host ‘All The People’ Tour

Continuing The Spirit Of Easter

“But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen...” (2 Peter 3:18 NRSV)

We of the Yankton Area Ministerial Association take turns each week to write this column to hopefully give you inspiration in helping you to grow in your faith. I’m guessing that a vast majority of you went to an area church on Easter to worship and to hear the proclamation of God’s promise of salvation for us. If so, well and good. And so, on this first Friday of the first week of Easter, I’m using Peter’s second letter to the early church for us to reflect on our growth in faith – to not let your Easter Sunday experience at church be tucked away, back in the drawer of your dining room hutch, and not act on it for another year until next Easter.

Peter, as with all of the apostles, had a firm conviction that the constant study and reflection of the gospel of God’s grace is the greatest defense against being stymied in our growth in faith. He begins his letter as he ends it (the verse cited above): “Simon Peter, a servant and apostle of Jesus Christ, To those who have received a faith as precious as ours through the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ: May grace and peace be yours in abundance in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord...” (2 Peter 1:1-2

have the only real truth of the gospel, and who clamor for attention and allegiance. And so, just as the followers of Christ were in the 1st century, we too, need to be just as vigilant today, against those who twist the gospel truth by means of the false doctrines and other forms of heresy, and modern-day cults.

Many people want God’s grace and peace, but are unwilling to put forth the effort to get to know God better. And that’s a tragedy when the “new life” that God initiates with his chosen people at baptism. don’t show any growth. Think not, though, that one cannot grow in faith! Just because we’ve completed grade school or high school, or the church’s confirmation classes, doesn’t mean our growth in faith is complete. If we’re to be able to discern and withstand the lure of false prophets and teachers, cults, and other forms of idol worship, we need to continue to

Peter wrote this “teaching” letter to address God’s grace in the face of dealing with the trials of false teachings that had crept into the church. Just as in the 1st century, here in the 21st century, the same sort of false teachings abound. Because of sin, our world is still filled with false prophets and teachers who claim to

do the practical things taught by the apostles (and the church) to grow in our faith.

In her book, “Amazing Grace,” South Dakota poet and author, Kathleen Norris, describes faith as a “continual process of learning (and re-learning) what it means to love God, neighbor, and oneself.” (page 2) She goes on to say that “faith is not readily understandable, which makes it suspect among people who have been educated to value ideas insofar as they are comprehensible, quantifiable, and consistent... Faith doesn’t conform itself to ideology, but to experience. And for the Christian, this means the experience of the person of Jesus Christ, not as someone who once lived in Galilee, but who lives now in all believers...” (page 4)

What then, can you do to “grow in the experience and grace of our Lord?” Bruce Bickel and Stan Jantz, in their book, “God in the Small Stuff,” say people think all that is required, is to pray once in awhile (i.e., when they get in trouble), attend worship once or twice a year (i.e., Christmas and Easter, weddings, baptisms, or funerals), and crack open the Bible once in a blue moon. But to really experience growth in faith in practical terms, they suggest doing the “little things over and over again” – that of combining regular bible study, prayer and worship, with a complete trust in God... Kosher Butcher Accused Of Using Non-Kosher Meat

LOS ANGELES — The U.S. Department of Agriculture has launched an investigation into the Doheny Glatt Kosher meat market in Los Angeles as controversy brews over the integrity of products sold there.

The owner of Doheny, Michael Engelman, faces accusations of selling meat that was not properly certified under kosher rules. Last week, a council of rabbis pulled Doheny’s kosher certification and, in a statement Friday, raised the possibility of “legal action,” a recourse to secular courts that would be rare.

Tuesday, the USDA’s Food Safety and Inspection Service confirmed that the Doheny market is under investigation. Officials declined to provide additional details because the investigation is ongoing.

Eric Agaki, a private investiga-

tor whose video recordings ignited the kosher meat controversy, said he met with USDA investigators March 25 and gave them materials he had collected during his own investigation. Though the exact nature of the USDA’s investigation was not clear, Agaki said investigators told him that USDA boxes are not supposed to be repacked.

The allegations have sharply divided L.A.’s Jewish community. Many longtime customers returned to the market Friday after it got a new kosher certification from local rabbis. Some supporters said they believed Engelman had been set up by other distrib-

utors who grew frustrated by his success.

In an interview with the *Los Angeles Times* on Monday, Agaki flatly denied those rumors.

“How can anybody set them up?” Agaki said of Engelman and his associates. “They did what they did. Nobody made them do it.

“Nobody hired me, nobody paid me,” he continued. “If anybody wants to pay me and send me donations, I’m glad to accept them.”

Agaki said his investigation into Doheny began about seven months ago when he was approached by a local rabbi. The

rabbi told him some community members were frustrated because Doheny was selling meat “way too cheap” and “putting a lot of people out of business.”

Sources also told Agaki that Doheny workers were picking up empty glatt kosher boxes from restaurants.

The video released to KTLA-TV was taken March 7, Agaki said. It purports to show one of Engelman’s associates loading his car with repacked glatt kosher boxes at an unsupervised warehouse in the San Fernando Valley. The associate later transfers them to Engelman at a McDonald’s, and Engelman unloads the boxes at his market when the overseer is absent.

Engelman could not be reached for comment Friday when the *Times* visited the market. Tuesday phone calls to the store went unanswered.
