



Wheat for May delivery rose 5 cents to \$6.99 a bushel; May corn fell 1 cent to \$6.29 a bushel; May oats added 0.5 cent to \$3.595 a bushel; while May soybeans fell 10.25 cents to \$13.6175 a bushel.

Beef and pork prices fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle fell 0.85 cent to \$1.215 a pound; May feeder cattle fell 1.65 cent to \$1.443 a pound; June lean hogs fell 2.32 cents to 89.7 cents a pound.
