#### **MISSOURI RIVER CLEAN-UP**

Saturday, May 4, 2013 will be the 10th year for the Missouri River Clean-Up. Volunteers can register to participate in the clean-up starting at 8:00am at Shelter #1 in Riverside Park. The shelter is located by the boat ramp on the east side of the park. Volunteers will be finished by Noon. An astounding amount of trash has been removed by local volunteers at the annual clean-up. During the 7 year period between 2005 and 2011, over 4,230 volunteer hours have been logged during the clean-ups. Unfortunately, the renewal of trash in the Missouri River and along its banks requires the need for more volunteers each year to continue the clean-up efforts. Over 10 miles of river shore-line have been cleaned with over 12 tons of general trash removed, 20 tons of metal, and 3 tons of tires. Please consider volunteering your time to help the clean-up effort in 2013.

- January-February – Returning community-gardeners have first chance for reserving their same garden spot. Reservations initially limited to 2 plots. Registration and pre-payment required.
- March 4 – 5:30 p.m. meeting at Avera Sacred Heart Hospital Physicians Office Pavilion for all gardeners to learn more about the Community Garden and for all new gardeners to make garden spot reservation. A waiting list will be created if demand is greater than plots available.

- April 28 – Tentative garden opening date (weather permitting).
- May 1 – Option for registered gardeners to reserve additional plots if any are available.
- June 1 – Gardens must be planted or gardeners forfeit pre-payment and registration. Unplanted gardens will be made available to other gardeners or those on the waiting list.

#### **2013 SOUTH DAKOTA KAYAK CHALLENGE**

May 25th and 26th beginning in historic Yankton, SD and ending in Sioux City, IA.

The South Dakota Kayak Challenge is a marathon-endurance paddling race that is approximately 72 miles of the Missouri National Recreational River. It was the first race of its kind in South Dakota when about 90 racers paddled it in 2010. In 2011, Missouri River flooding led to cancellation. Last year, almost 160 racers took part in a record-setting run. We welcome all racers who seek a challenge in an amazing part of the Midwest. Racers start at 7:00 a.m. on Saturday in Yankton and must reach the finish line before 1:00 p.m. on Sunday. Racers must check in at each of four checkpoints on the route. There are no cut-off times for the checkpoints; they are for resupply, support, and logistics.
