“Did you know my child is allergic to peanuts?”

“How much television will they watch?”

“Is there a safety lock on the medicine cabinet?”

“Do you mind if my child doesn’t eat sweets?”

“Can I give you my phone number in case of emergency?”

“How many children will be there?”

“Will the children be playing in the pool?”

“Will you be home?”

“Is there a gun where my child plays?”

40% of homes with children have guns, many left unlocked or loaded, and more than 10 children are killed or injured with those guns every day. You may ask a lot of questions about your child’s safety when you send your child to another home. Next time, ask if there’s a gun where your child plays.
