1 in the Summit League — good for third place. USD has 18 games remaining (including a rescheduled doubleheader with Creighton at some point), with 15 of those against conference teams.

Barring some major meltdown, the Coyotes look like a post-season team. Four teams advance to the Summit League Championships, set for May 9-11 in Fargo, N.D. The winner of the league crown earns an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. Of course, that's a long way down the road for USD, and the Coyotes would eventually have to topple 4team defending champion North Dakota State.

One thing playing in USD's favor for a potential title, though? Fourthplace Omaha, at 27-5 and 5-1, is ineligible for the Summit League tournament, and therefore the Coyotes would only have to avoid falling two spots in the standings.

Picked sixth in the pre-season poll after winning just 16 games last year, USD is already exceeding expectations this season. The Coyotes are set to host pre-season No. 2 Fort Wayne for a 3-game series this weekend in Vermillion, but of course we'll wait out what happens with the field conditions.

But he was allowed to play in the national championship game, and Nebraska fans cheered him loudly and proudly as he led the Cornhuskers to 62-24 methodical dismantling of the Gators.

Why did Nebraska fans cheer Phillips so emphatically that delirious night in the desert?
