



Niobrara And Ponca Bluffs Conservation Meetings Moved To New Dates

With the unexpected intensity and duration of the current winter storm, the Fish and Wildlife Service and National Park Service will be postponing both public meetings for the proposed Niobrara Confluence and Ponca Bluffs Conservation Areas until next week.
The new meeting schedule is as follows:

- Wednesday, April 17 — 6-8 p.m., Vermillion Public Library, 18 Church Street, Vermillion;
- Thursday, April 18 — 6-8 p.m., Lutheran Fellowship Hall, 2532 Apple Street (Just south of Moody Motors), Niobrara, Neb.

Individual or group representatives may visit the project website <http://parkplanning.nps.gov/niobponca> — to learn more or to provide comments. The Service and NPS will gather public input as part of public comment period until June 14, 2013. All comments received before June 14 will be considered by the agencies during completion of the final environmental impact statement.
Public meetings regarding the draft plan will begin with an informational presentation followed by an open house where individuals can meet one-on-one with the Service and NPS staff for additional discussion. Information will continue to be broadcast via local radio stations in the event of a cancellation or further postponement.

The class is free and open to the public. Make reservations by calling 668-8080 as space is limited.


BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were mixed Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for May delivery fell 12 cents to \$6.9675 a bushel; May corn rose 4.75 cents to \$6.49 a bushel; May oats rose 1.75 cent to \$3.6925 a bushel; while May soybeans fell 2.75 cents to \$13.9275 a bushel.
Beef and pork prices fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
June live cattle fell 1.7 cent to \$1.20 a pound; May feeder cattle fell 2.43 cents to \$1.4232 a pound; June lean hogs fell 0.35 cent to 89.5 cents a pound.
