Extension To Offer Workshop On Ice Damage

BROOKINGS — The ice storm that moved through the Sioux Empire has left thousands of broken and damaged trees in its wake. Many tree owners are looking out at their bent and broken trees and wondering whether the trees can be saved and if so, what can be done. To help people with these decisions, SDSU Extension and the South Dakota Department of Agriculture are hosting a workshop at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, April 16, at the Sioux Falls Regional Extension Center, 2001 East 8th Street. This workshop will be led by Dr. John Ball, Extension Forestry Specialist and Rick Mayko, Community Forester. They will discuss and demonstrate how tree owner can decide whether a tree is worth saving and the pruning and repair techniques that can be done to restore a tree. They will also cover repairing ice-damaged shrubs, evergreens and fruit trees. Tips on hiring a tree company to perform work on larger trees will also be discussed. The event is free to the public. Feeding South Dakota Seeks Volunteers For Hunger Study

SIOUX FALLS — Feeding South Dakota is participating in the national Hunger in America 2014 study, an in-depth, quadrennial look at its clients, in an effort to find ways to better serve those in need in the community. As part of the study, Feeding South Dakota is looking to recruit volunteers from the community to help facilitate a survey to capture detailed information about who is in need of emergency food assistance and their circumstances. Client data will be collected at local nonprofit agencies (pantries, shelters, kitchens) that receive food from Feeding South Dakota, and the data collection will occur from April to August 2013. "The Hunger Study is the only of its kind and helps to provide an depth look at the issue of hunger, not only across America, but within our local community and across our state," said Matt Gassen, executive director of Feeding South Dakota. However,

because of its vast scope, the study will not be possible without dedicated volunteers." Feeding South Dakota, part of the Feeding America network, is participating in the study along with nearly 200 other food banks across the country. When completed, Hunger in America will be the largest study of charitable food assistance in the United States, providing comprehensive and statistically-valid data on the charitable food distribution system and the people being served by the Feeding America network. The last study, Hunger in America 2010, resulted in an extremely detailed report, drawing on data from more than 61,000 interviews with clients and surveys of 37,000 feeding agencies. Bloomfield Student Named Candidate In Presidential Scholars Program

BLOOMFIELD, Neb. — Nicholas Nagengast, a graduating senior at Bloomfield High School, has been named one of more than 3,000 candidates in the 2013 U.S. Presidential Scholars Program. The candidates were selected from nearly 3.4 million students expected to graduate from U.S. high schools in the year 2013. Inclusion in the U.S. Presidential Scholars Program, now in its 49th year, is one of the highest honors bestowed upon graduating high school seniors. Scholars are selected on the basis of superior academic and artistic achievements, leadership qualities, strong character and involvement in community and school activities. More than 3,000 candidates were selected for their exceptional performance on either the College Board SAT or the ACT Assessment. In addition, each Chief State School Officer (CSSO) was invited to nominate three male and three female candidates, based on their outstanding scholarship, residing in the CSSO's jurisdiction. Further consideration is based on students' essays, self-assessments, descriptions of activities, school recommendations, and school transcripts. A distin-

guished panel of educators will review these submissions and select 500 semifinalists in early April. The Commission on Presidential Scholars, a group of up to 32 eminent citizens appointed by the president, will make final selection of the Scholars. They will select one young man and one young woman from each state, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and U.S. students living abroad; 15 students at-large; and up to 20 students from the creative and performing arts. The U.S. Department of Education will announce the Scholars in May. Scholars will be invited to Washington for several days in June to receive the Presidential Scholars Medallion at a recognition ceremony and to participate in events and activities with their elected representatives, educators, and other leading individuals in public life.
